## Greetings from your Congregational Council

February 7 was a big day for Zion. A group of individuals attended the first of seven workshops that will lead to a working & enforceable Child Protection Policy for our church. Over the last few months we have mentioned that this was something that we've committed to, and it is great to finally begin the process. In order for this to work, we need the participation of the entire congregation. This is a huge task which does not end with the implementation of the policy. We will need a group to oversee and enforce the policy; without everyone's help we cannot succeed. Failure is not an option; without a working and enforced policy we will not be able to have activities for children and youth. A big thanks to lay members Pat Landis, Kim Paternoster, and Pat Brady for volunteering for this challenge, and to Pastor JMe and Chris Reinford who also attended the workshop. We are still looking for one or two other individuals so if you are interested, contact one of the team members listed above, or Jon Wright.

While our Safe Church team was attending the workshop, the Council met for 5 1/2 hours to discuss the feedback from the Discernment Cottage Meetings and to make some plans to put the findings into action. On February 8, Doug Rhoads presented a summary at both services He outlined our "4 Action Pillars" for 2015: (1) Improving Communication, (2) More Fellowship Opportunities, (3) Create a new approach to our Ministry Teams, and (4) Building Improvements. If you were not able to attend services that day you can request a copy of his presentation by contacting the church office.



## FOOD PANTRY UPDATE Submitted by Diane Gerlach

**In January,** the pantry served 194 families which included 270 children, 387 adults, and 91 seniors for a total of 748 people served. **We registered 17 new families and re-registered 3 previous families.** 

**During January, Zion members donated 71 pounds of food** to the pantry. Thank you to the members who continue to contribute financially to the pantry.



During the month of January....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 1,567 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Target in Lititz donated 1,142 pounds

of fresh produce and bakery items; **Weis Markets in Columbia** donated 1,501 pounds of bread and bakery items. **Weis Stony Battery Road** donated 306 pounds of bread and bakery items.

We continue to be blessed with many volunteers from community churches who give their time to the pantry each Monday and Wednesday as well as additional time as needed. Seventy four volunteers gave 630 hours for the month of January.
