From the Pastor's Keyboard:

I've recently been going through old pictures of family members and events that had been stashed among my mother's memorabilia in our garage. It all started with wanting to have pictures of my mom, dad and other family members to insert into the Family Tree Maker genealogical chart that I started a couple of months ago.

Over and over again, I've wondered, "Now, who is that?," as I've peered at pictures of various members of my family and of my mother's friends. There are very few photos that have identities of the subjects noted on the backs. I wish that I had sat with my mother while she was alive, looked through the hundreds of photos that she saved, written down the names and recorded her stories about them.

There are many familiar family names that I've encountered while compiling the family tree. I remember my mother mentioning these folks in stories she told about growing up. Many were deceased before I was born; others I may have met in the early years of my life. It would be so nice to be able to pair a face with each of these names. Somehow, I feel more connected to a person when I know what he or she looks like.

Perhaps this is why, throughout the years, artists have attempted to draw or paint pictures of Jesus the Christ. When we connect this powerful name with a face that seems to fit, he becomes more real and easier to relate to as "true God and true man". Like Thomas, the doubter, we humans usually prefer to see in order to believe. One wise person stated,

"The world says 'I'll believe when I see it. Faith says, 'I'll see it when I believe it.'" (cont'd on pg. 2)

As I've learned about my family and all its various branches that spread from the United States to Europe, the most fascinating part of the process has been

uncovering the stories about various individuals' lives and experiences. If you have ever done any genealogical work, you know that finding these stories takes a lot of time and research. Yet, it is the stories that truly bring life to the names on a family tree even more than photos.

We don't really know what Jesus looked like, but his story has been shared for 2000 years. However you or I may picture him, the stories about his life and actions have made him real for us and for people throughout the world. These stories, from eye witnesses and generations of followers after them, have caused people to believe in him and to follow his teachings. It is through belief, through faith, that we see the truth about Jesus and his love, grace, forgiveness and promise of salvation. In believing, one sees how Jesus' love is reflected in himself and in the lives of other Christians.

It's important for parents to share with their children pictures of other family members and to talk about who they are and what they did during their lives. This

historical show and tell about our ancestors helps us to feel connected to our larger family. It's just as important for us to share with our children the scriptural stories of Jesus and how his life connects with us as individuals and as a community of faith today. These family stories breathe life into our lives of faith and connect us to all those whom Jesus calls his family.

"[Jesus] said to them, 'My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it." (Luke 8:21 NRS)

Safe Church 101: Education for All Adult Members of Zion

Is Zion a Safe Church for children and youth? We hope so! But what can we do to insure that it is, now and in the future? Not only are there biblical and ethical precepts that we, as a Christian community, are called to follow but also there are legal mandates that we are required to follow as a community organization.

On Saturday, May 16, there will be an important presentation for all adult members of Zion (18+ years old) on the steps we must take to insure that Zion is a Safe Church. Dinner will be served at 6 PM, followed by a presentation by a Samaritan Center Staff member at 7 PM. Child care will be provided in the Nursery. Furthermore, if you are a volunteer who works with the children or youth of Zion in any of its ministries, you are considered a "Mandatory Reporter." This presentation will provide information about what this means and what your role is in making Zion a Safe Church.





10 'Breath Prayers' to Pray

When you can't stop in a church or kneel, these short, simple prayers can be spoken in a single breath.

- 1) "Lord, have mercy." The Desert Fathers, monastic Christians in Egypt in the third and fourth centuries, often prayed the prayer many know as the "Kyrie Eleison" (Greek for "Lord, have mercy"). Also called the "Jesus Prayer" when pronounced as "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner," it is rooted in Psalm 123:3, Luke 18:13, and Luke 18:38.
- 2) "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." Based on the words of the boy Samuel (1 Samuel 3:9) pray these words to quiet your soul and express your desire to hear from God.
- 3) "My help comes from the Lord, the maker of heaven and earth." Pray this prayer of affirmation and dependence, from Psalm 121:2, in times of need and desperation. It reminds us that our help does not come from our own strength or the support of others, but from God.
- 4) "Here I am." This is a <u>prayer of presence</u>, and <u>availability</u>, based on the cry of the prophet in Isaiah 6:8.
- 5) "Show your power." Pray this prayer (based on Psalm 68:28, among others) to intercede for others, particularly when the need is great and the situation dire.
- 6) "When I am afraid, I will trust you." This prayer

- (Psalm 56:3) <u>helps you to remain calm and trustful</u> <u>when you are tempted by worry and fear.</u>
- 7) "Not my will, but yours." This prayer, of course, echoes Jesus' prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane (Luke 22:42). Like the previous prayer, it helps to pray this "breath prayer" when you are anxious or impatient. It places the praying heart in a position of surrender, where great answers are likely to come.
- 8) "Bring your kingdom." Based on the prayer Jesus taught his earliest followers (Luke 11:2, this prayer is helpful when feeling overwhelmed by sadness or devastating news. In just a few words, it expresses a heartfelt desire for the day when "the salvation and the power and the kingdom of our God" (Revelation 12:10) will be fully realized and the Evil One will be defeated.
- 9) "Say the word." When a Roman centurion sent word to Jesus asking him to heal a sick servant, he told Jesus that he didn't even feel worthy for the Lord to come into his house. He simply requested, "Say the word, and my servant will be healed" (Luke 7:7). Jesus commended the centurion's faith, for his request showed that he knew Jesus could heal with a word. So pray for someone's healing--from sickness, addiction, emotional pain, depression, etc.--with this breath prayer.
- 10) "Come, Lord Jesus." Breathe this prayer--the last prayer recorded in the Bible (Revelation 22:20)--not only as a prayer for Christ's return but also as a prayer for him to come repeatedly, constantly, into situations and struggles.





Stephen Ministry

The Ministry of Listening

Think of a time when you really felt cared for. Chances are someone focused on what you had to say, was attentive to your needs, and listened to how you felt instead of telling you how you should feel or what you should do.

Listening is one of the most powerful ministry tools at your disposal. It demonstrates that you care about the other person. In Stephen Ministry, a great deal of time is spent in teaching and practicing listening skills because of its importance as a caregiving tool. You too - even if you aren't a Stephen Minister - can become a more caring listener by understanding and applying these six listening concepts:

- 1. **Listening is active:** Focus on what the person has to say instead of thinking about what you'll say next. Look at him or her while you listen and nod along from time to time so they know you are tuned in.
- 2. Listening take patience: Often you need to build trust before someone will open up to you. Constant, patient listening is a key.
- 3. Listening involves more than just words: Pay attention to what is said and also to what is not said (like body language).
- 4. Good listeners aren't completely silent: Restate key thoughts or ideas to be sure you understood the person correctly or ask focused questions to encourage the person to reach a little deeper.
- 5. **Listening happens over time:** One conversation might build upon an earlier one. Listen for any recurring themes or patterns in what the person shares. Are there any contradictions? These are signs there may be more to explore underneath.
- 6. **Listening is confidential:** A great way to build trust and to show the person you really care for him or her is to maintain confidentiality and not to share with others what was told to you in private conversation.

Jesus was the model of a good listener. Much of his ministry was listening to people. By listening to what people had to say, he demonstrated how much he really cared about them. Remember the stories of the woman at the well, Nicodemus, or the disciples on the road to Emmaus. All of these were times when Jesus showed his care and concern by first listening to people and then giving them what they needed. We all want Zion to be a caring place where members and guests truly feel people care about who they are and how they feel. Just as our Stephen Ministers use good listening skills to communicate how much they care, so can you. Follow and practice these listening principles and make a concentrated effort toward becoming a better listener. Listening is a great gift we can give to one another, and one we can all use in order to help make Zion a more caring place.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In March, the pantry served 180 families which included 253 children, 361 adults, and 84 seniors for a total of 698 people served. We registered 10 new families.

During the month of March, Zion members donated 103 pounds of food to the pantry. Thank you Zion members for your continued support through the donation of food items and financial contributions.

During the month of March....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 2,118 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Target in Lititz donated 1,473 pounds of fresh produce and bakery items; Weis Markets in Columbia donated 1,088 pounds of bread and bakery items. Weis Stony Battery Road donated 390 pounds of bread and bakery items.

We continue to be blessed with many volunteers from the Hempfield area and our Hempfield community churches who give their time to the pantry each Monday and Wednesday as well as additional time as needed. Sixty eight volunteers gave 667 hours for the month of March.




