

• Church Council Update Submitted by Jon Wright

Greetings,

As I write this newsletter article I realize that some of this may be old news. In June, VBS was held during the week when Council normally meets so we rescheduled our meeting to the following week. We met June 22 at which time we were brought up to speed about what is happening in the life of the church in the various Ministry Teams. There are a couple of unfortunate issues that have come up which Council has needed to address that I will share with you here.


In May I received complaints from two individuals regarding inappropriate behavior by the Zion softball team. This team was operating unknown to the Pastor or any of the Council members. Over the years participants from our church have dwindled to the point where there was only one member of Zion on the team. After discussions with past members of the team, as well as a previous participant from another church team, it became evident that the leaders of the team were not projecting an image that we want to have associated with our church. A major concern was the lack of Zion participation including leadership and oversight by one or more Zion members. Based on the information that we gathered the Council voted to disband the team immediately. The league Commissioner and team captain were contacted by Pastor JMe to let them know our decision. Personally I feel that the league holds some responsibility for the situation that we faced. The league has nothing in place to guarantee that a church is aware of that a team is being fielded, or to allow the church to approve the roster. Council encourages anyone that is interested in forming a team for next season to feel free to do so. The Council and Pastor only require that a significant percentage of the team be comprised of Zion members, and that one or more active members, meaning those that regularly attend worship and volunteer their service, are willing to serve as coach and oversee the team. In addition, bulletin and newsletter announcements should be used to advertise the team so that all members are aware that they may participate.

On another note...Many of you may have heard through the Zion grapevine that the Property Team and Council have been dealing with a snow removal contractor who presented us with a bill of \$15,000 for snow removal this year. At the request of the Property Team the snow removal contract explicitly stated that there should be no snow removal unless the total exceeded 2 inches. Even though the contractor amended the contract for this provision and both Zion and the contractor signed off on it, we were charged for snow removal labor regardless of the 3 snowfall total. The team and I met with the contractor on May 4th. The meeting did not end well but it was pointed out to the contractor that we were billed a hefty amount for two separate dates where there was absolutely no snowfall. He agreed to go back and review his records and submit a new invoice. Prior to the meeting Zion did send him a check for \$5000, the amount being based on the snow removal costs in 2014. When we received the edited invoice Jere Grube confirmed with the contractor that the edited amount was in addition to the \$5000 that we had already paid. The decision was made to not do anything and wait for the contractor to make the next move. We received a notice on June 10 that a civil action was entered against us at the magistrate's office. A meeting of the Council, Property Team, and some past Council Presidents was held between services on June 14. We all agreed that the contract was violated by the contractor and that Zion is in the right on this issue. It was decided to enter a defense against this action. We have obtained representation for this hearing which is scheduled to be held on July 8th. We are certain that the Magistrate will find in favor of Zion and further updates will be provided when information is available.

I hope that everyone has a safe and wonderful summer. Please remember our youth and their chaperones as they travel to Detroit for the Youth Gathering this summer.





The Prayer That Changed My Life

Years ago I traveled to San Antonio to meet with a friend and spiritual mentor. While we enjoyed a lunch of great Mexican food, we caught up on each other's lives and ministries

Later, with full stomachs and warm hearts, we walked out of the restaurant to say our farewells and head our respective ways.

But, my mentor wasn't quite finished with me. He asked me to join him in his old, beatup Ford Bronco for a few moments of prayer. I gladly complied. Those few moments marked me forever.

My mentor asked God for something I had never heard before. He prayed that I would love to pray. He prayed that I would enjoy praying. He prayed that it would be easy for me to pray.

His words blew me away. I had never before thought about praying about my prayer life. But I've been praying about it ever since.

The prophet Isaiah spoke an amazing promise to Gentiles who embraced the God of Israel: God would bring them to His holy mountain (a metaphor for His holy presence) and would make them joyful in His house of prayer (see Isaiah 56:6-7). What a beautiful image! For many of us, prayer is drudgery, work, and flat-out boring.

Most Christians would rather endure a root canal than be forced to spend an hour in prayer. But it doesn't have to be that way. Prayer doesn't have to be an hour of

hard labor.

Start praying for God to help you love prayer. Use the language of Isaiah and ask God to make you joyful in His house of prayer. God will honor your request. I know, because over the last 20 years He has answered mine.

I can trace my desire to pray and my joy in prayer all the way back to those few moments in that Bronco. God honored my mentor's prayers for me, and He's been honoring mine ever since.

O God, give me a heart of prayer. Let prayer be easy for me. Help me see it as a joy, not labor, and a privilege, not a chore. Precious God, do as Your Word promises. Make me joyful in Your house of prayer.

Do you have a prayer life? If not, this is an excellent way to get started or to improve on a so-so prayer life. God loves you and He wants to have a relationship with you. He wants to be your friend - someone to take all your joys and sorrows to. This relationship, however, depends on your willingness to spend time with God. He is waiting patiently for each of us to either start a prayer life or to improve upon the one we have. Pray right now that God will give you a heart of prayer. Make this a habit - do it daily. I think you will be amazed at how your life and your relationship with God will be.







Synod Assembly Report Submitted by Doug & Connie Grow

Report on the Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly June 5-7 at Messiah College

As attendees for the second time, Doug and I were able to get a clearer picture of the value of a Synod Assembly. We arrived on Friday and attended 3 sessions and a forum ending on Saturday. Seating for the sessions and the forum were comfortable theater style. Large screens were used to assure all could see the proceedings. Humor was used throughout the speakers' remarks and included music by Rachel Kurtz during the sessions.

The Bishop's talk concerned the growth of our Lutheran Church population. His concerns included the conditions of our church facilities which are in need of improvement, the growth in some churches is faltering, and the need for merging some churches where the population has dropped below sustainability.

Session 2 included a Bible study on the following Bible passages:

- 1) A study on the Word using John 1:1-5. Words were circled that John used to describe the Word.
 - 2) The Word as Life: Matthew 8: 5-16.
 - 3) What did the Word do for the people?: Romans 1: 16-17.

This session continued with a choice of forums with a boxed lunch.

We attended the "Does the Church Matter?" session. The lesson was a discussion that focused on the challenges, or the transitions occurring, during the present time. The issues discussed were:

- 1) More diversity due to the longer life spans causing changes in the family structure.
- 2) Digital technology
- 3) Religious diversity (There are fewer Christians in America because the population is more diverse culturally and therefore, religiously.)
 - 4) Decline in faith formation in the home
 - 5) Fear of change

The Lutheran church is entering a period of change, thus the church needs to create ways to promote the message of Jesus by a media approach. The church can no longer expect people to come to church. The church must reach out in the community and use digital devices and other means to contact the population. Several videos showed examples of other churches using Web Pages, Facebook, and other digital means.

The business of the Synod such as elections, reports of committees, memorials, Lutheran World Relief presentation, Synod Council report, Bishop's report, and Malaria relief report were spaced out in the three sessions. Ms. Wyvetta Bullock, Assistant to Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, provided a report as the ELCA Representative to the Assembly.

We highly recommend this experience to everyone. If you're interested in hearing more, please don't hesitate to reach out to one of us!

Food Pantry Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In May, the pantry served 182 families which included 242 children, 357 adults, and 83 seniors for a total of 682 people served. We registered 9 new families.



During the month of May, Zion members donated 175 pounds of food to the pantry. Thank you Zion members for your continued support through the donation of food items and financial contributions. Your financial contributions are used to purchase food items on sale at various grocery stores and the Central Penn Food Bank.

During the month of May....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 1,642 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Target in Lititz donated 1,932 pounds of fresh produce and bakery items; Weis Markets in Columbia donated 1,208 pounds of bread and bakery items. Other food donated through stores, food drives, individual churches, and private donations totaled 8,086 pounds of food. In addition, the pantry purchased 468 pounds of food items to maintain the supplies on our shelves.

We continue to be blessed with many volunteers from the Hempfield area and our Hempfield community churches who give their time to the pantry each Monday and Wednesday as well as additional time as needed. Sixty three volunteers gave 547 hours for the month of May.

YOU are welcome to visit the community pantry located here at Zion on our "open" days to witness God's hands, heart, and love in action! Monday and Wednesday from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM.

Jelly, peanut butter, 15 oz. canned fruit, and cereal continue to be some of the "main" items the pantry can always use!!!

Together we will feed the hungry!
