the joy of life in Jesus through your regular offerings to your community of faith and service at Zion when you are absent from us.





In the Spirit of change towards more effective communication, more meaningful and focused preparation for worship and smoother flow of our services, there will be a few differences in the orders for our services beginning May 31.

The most noticeable change will be in the placement of verbal announcements. There will no longer be a time of verbal announcements or shared joys and concerns at the beginning of the services. Video announcements will still be played before each service begins. Any verbal announcements, such as schedule changes or ministry updates, in addition to those shown in the videos may be made after the Post-Communion Prayer and before the Benediction. If your Ministry Team has an upcoming event or activity to announce, please keep your verbal notice short and to the point. Specifics about the event/activity should be provided through other means of congregation communications (bulletin board poster, monthly newsletter, weekly updates, webpage, Facebook, etc.). Send this information to Anne in the Church Office (zionluth@comcast.net) well in advance of the event, and she will get the word out. Use of the Prayer Request box in the Narthex, contact with the Prayer Team or Church Office, or writing a note that can be shared through our weekly updates, are the best means for prayer requests or sharing of personal information (e.g., joys and concerns) with your church community.



# **Receptivity to Care**

Most people are much more open to giving care than to receiving it. When a person is giving care, he or she is in a position of strength, stability, and authority. When a person is receiving care, he or she is acknowledging weakness, insecurity, and vulnerability.

As a result, there are countless people today who, though they really could benefit from a Christian friend who would listen and care for them, tough it out on their own. They remain the strong & silent type, or wear a smile across a face that is holding back a flood of tears. Society encourages this (particularly for men). To ask for help is to admit weakness. To show weakness is to admit inferiority.

But God did not create us to be independent. We were created to be interdependent. God's Word is clear on this all the way back to Genesis: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a helper suitable for him" (Genesis 2:18). The New Testament underscores this theme with more than 50 verses that contain the words "one another." These verses include admonitions such as "love one another," "encourage one another," "build up one another," and "pray for one another."

What these verses don't say is that we alone are to love, encourage, build up, and pray for other people. The "one another" wording gives them a reciprocal meaning. It also tells us that we are to allow other people to love, encourage, build up, and pray for us!

It is most difficult for people to ask for help. Whether it is because of guilt, shame, inadequacy, or fear of rejection, many would

much prefer to suffer alone than ask for help.

But suffering alone is not God's intent for us. Bear one an Jesus promises,



"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). We can receive this promised rest when we turn to one another for comfort and help.

Our Stephen Ministers know all about receiving care. Many of them have been on the receiving end of care at an earlier point in their lives—something that has motivated them to give care now. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follows. They know how to respond in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care that which God very much desires you to have.

If you find yourself -- now or in the future -- facing difficulties in life, don't succumb to society's norm of remaining strong and suffering alone. Take the courageous step of seeking help. Open your heart to receiving God's love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to you and provide you with the care and encouragement you need while Christ works inside to bring rest to your weary, burdened heart.



We are grateful for and appreciative of all the great volunteers who have continued to make Zion's Christ Lutheran Meal Ministry possible! It is with sadness that it was decided at the Christ Lutheran Meal Meeting recently that this ministry is coming to an end. The last meal to be served at Christ Lutheran will be on August 20th, making *Zion's final meal at Christ Lutheran on July 9th.* 

All the hard work begins days before the meal is scheduled. On the day of the meal, different groups of God's servants work from early in the morning until about 8 PM in the evening until everything is cleaned, returned, and put away. We are thankful for the help provided by our brothers and sisters in Christ from Bright Side Baptist Church in Lancaster who have partnered with Zion to give of their time and talents by serving food and drinks and assisting with clean-up. (Think brooms, mops, buckets, cleaning cloths, sanitizer and muscle power!)

The majority of our volunteers have helped out at all six meals throughout the year. Of course, <u>all</u> of the people who have helped out and filled in sporadically have been appreciated wholeheartedly as well.

If you are able to help out on July 9th with any part of the meal preparation, serving, or cleaning-up, please contact Linda Bear or Connie Álsedek.

- Day Jobs: Pick-up and deliver groceries to Zion, food prep and cooking, set-up, food delivery to Christ Lutheran
- Late Afternoon/Early Evening Jobs: Host/hostess, servers, clean-up, supplies returned to Zion.

While the meal will not continue at Christ Lutheran, it will continue at the other churches in the city. This has been a special ministry in the life of Zion with Christ Lutheran; now the door is open to new and different possibilities & opportunities of service.

# ◆ Food Pantry Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In April, the pantry served 195 families which included 279 children, 390 adults, and 87 seniors for a total of 756 people served. We registered 11 new families.



**During the month of April, Zion members donated 262 pounds of food** to the pantry. Thank you Zion members for your continued support through the donation of food items and financial contributions. Your financial contributions are used to purchase food items on sale at various grocery stores and the Central Penn Food Bank.

During the month of April....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 1,747 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Target in Lititz donated 1,193 pounds of fresh produce and bakery items; Weis Markets in Columbia donated 1,199 pounds of bread and bakery items. Weis Stony Battery Road donated 147 pounds of bread and bakery items. Other food donated through food drives, individual churches, and private donations totaled 8,807 pounds of food. In addition, the pantry purchased 1,140 pounds of food items to maintain the supplies on our shelves.

We continue to be blessed with many volunteers from the Hempfield area and our Hempfield community churches who give their time to the pantry each Monday and Wednesday as well as additional time as needed. Seventy three volunteers gave 678 hours for the month of April.

YOU are welcome visit the community pantry located here at Zion on our "open" days to witness God's hands, heart, and love in action! Monday and Wednesday from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM. Jelly, peanut butter, 15 oz. canned fruit, and cereal continue to be some of the "main" items the pantry can always use!!!

Together we will feed the hungry!
