From the Pastor's Keyboard: "Christian Education? Christian Formation? Faith Formation?"

In most areas of human life, there is terminology that changes according to the times, culture, and particular goals of organizations. This is true not only in the secular world but also in the church. These changes can be confusing, even troubling, for those who have been actively involved in a particular organization, industry, or denomination for many years. There are times, however, when these terminology changes truly make a difference in how one views the particular concept that is being described.

For example: What first comes to your mind when you read or hear the term, *Christian Education?* I would guess that most folks would immediately think of Sunday morning educational activities for children and youth, or Sunday School.

When I came to Zion, the Christian Education Team's focus was almost entirely on the educational opportunities for children and youth. However, Zion is blessed with several Sunday morning classes for adult learners, also. When a decision about scheduling was made about the Sunday morning programming for children and youth, the impact this would make on the adult classes was often overlooked. There was a sense that Christian Education is only for children and only happens on Sunday mornings. (Cont'd on pg. 2)

Over the years, we've been working hard to ensure that there was someone on the team to represent the educational programs for adults. The team has become more aware of what is happening with our Nursery School, Confirmation program, and weekly studies for adults. In addition, team leaders meet quarterly to share their schedules of events and ideas so that the team ministries will recognize ways in which they can work together.

The more we share our ideas, plans and goals, the more our ministry teams are realizing how their ministries are interconnected in the life of the congregation. There are components of Christian Education within our worship, within our fellowship, within our evangelism, within our stewardship and finance, within our caring for one another, within our social outreach, within our youth ministries, and within our property upkeep and maintenance. Connecting Christian teachings and practices with life happens more outside of the Sunday morning time slot than during Sunday School.

Christian Formation or Faith Formation are terms used in recent years better to describe the life-long process of connecting faith and life. A person doesn't stop learning when they graduate from school or when they are confirmed in the church. No matter your age, you can continue to grow in understanding of your relationship with Jesus Christ and how this provides guidance for and hope in your everyday life.

Those who are involved in bible studies and faith discussions during adult-hood gain new insights and learn new things that build upon their childhood faith experiences. Continued involvement in bible study, practicing daily devotions, sharing the importance of your faith with children and grandchildren are all ways that your personal faith understanding further develops and matures. There are many opportunities for personal faith formation for all ages at Zion.

Faith Formation is what Martin Luther describes in this famous quote, ""This life therefore is not righteousness, but growth in righteousness, not health, but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise. We are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it, the process is not yet finished, but it is going on, this is not the end, but it is the road. All does not yet gleam in glory, but all is being purified."

How to Pray God's Promises

(by Norman Vincent Peale)

How to pray God's promises when you feel fearful, alone, or simply want a more joyful life.

If we will but turn to God, He can help us with all our needs. He tells us this again and again in the Bible. Here are seven of the many Scriptural promises. Read each promise in a highly personal way, relating it to yourself. Concentrate on the one you most need now. Say, "I hereby accept this promise and will use it this day."

1. When You Need Courage

...As I was with Moses, so I will be with you: I will not fail you, nor forsake you. Be strong and of a good courage...Joshua 1:5,6

We are not alone. God will never forsake us but will protect, guide and comfort us at any time, anywhere. When the going is hard and you feel insecure and maybe fearful, just repeat this wonderful promise.

2. For a More Joyful Life

...Whosoever will save is life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it. Matthew 16:25

This is a curious promise that runs counter to the modern materialistic conception that to have, one must get and keep. But for people who live only for themselves, life shrinks and finally withers. But for those who give generously to help other people in Christ's name life grows ever richer. The more you give the more you receive from life.

3. Removing an Obstacle

And Jesus said to them...for truly I tell you, If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, Move from here to there, and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you. Matthew 17:20,21

A mustard seed is very small but you do not need a well-developed faith to move mountainous difficulties. Just a little faith will do it but it must be the real thing, the kind that comes by deep desire and earnest prayer and disciplinary dealing with yourself. Armed with this genuine faith, that which formerly seemed impossible becomes

gloriously possible.

4. Victory Over Temptation

Blessed is the man that endures temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord has promised to them that love Him. James 1:12

Temptation is the urge to do or say something contrary to the will of God and the law of Christ. It often is pleasurable and the mind attempts to rationalize it, to make it seem all right. If we do not give in to evil we shall become rulers of ourselves. And He will help us gain its victory.

5. When You Need Forgiveness

If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9

You carry a heavy burden when sin is in your life. Many people live ineffective lives because of it. But this relief-giving promise tells us that if we freely confess to Him our wrongdoing and sincerely ask forgiveness, Jesus Christ will give new life to us.

6. When a Loved-One is III

And the prayer of faith shall save the sick, and the Lord shall raise him up...James 5:15

People, who have been given up by doctors and loved ones, have often been healed when someone has had enough faith to put them unreservedly into the hands of the Great Physician. There is tremendous power in the prayer of faith as applied in cases of illness, whether of the body or the mind.

7. God's Greatest Promise

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life. John 3:16

This is one of the most majestic of all Biblical promises. Jesus took upon Himself our guilt and paid with His own life for our sins. It represents God's supreme entreaty, His profoundest appeal to us. The great promise is that if we believe in the atoning power of Christ's death on our behalf we shall not perish when we die but have everlasting life.


HALLOWEEN MYSTERY DINNER




PUPPET PLAYERS





Stewardship Emphasis 2015: Fearless Generosity

Sunday September 20th was the beginning of a four-week stewardship emphasis for our congregation called Fearless Generosity. Through special sermons, children's chats, Sunday School lessons, bible studies and other activities, we are learning how to become more faithful stewards as we explore what it means to practice:

- · fearless living;
- fearless service;
- · fearless sowing; and
- · fearless giving.

During September, we focused on the first two of these concepts during worship in creative and inviting ways. The themes for October 4 and 11 will be "Fearless Sowing" and "Fearless Giving." On October 3rd, 10-11:30 a.m., there will be a special presentation on Legacy Giving provided by Pastor Liz Polantzke. More information about this program follows.

As we draw near to the culmination of this year's stewardship emphasis, you will be invited to provide an estimate or make a commitment for your giving during 2016 by completing a "Fearless Generosity" card. October 11 will be a celebration of Zion's fearless generosity both in worship and afterwards with a special pot luck meal and program. This Celebration Sunday will be an opportunity to join together to present our estimates or commitments of giving in support of the ministry and mission to which we are called as Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church.

When we practice fearless generosity, Paul's blessing to the church in Ephesians 3:20-21 becomes a blessing for Zion Lutheran Church. Using us as willing vessels, God through the Holy Spirit—the power at work within us—is able to accomplish abundantly far more than we can ask or imagine. May Paul's prayer for the church at Ephesus be our prayer as we live out God's call to be fearless givers and fearless stewards—as individuals and as a community of faith.

We ask that you pray that God will lead you to be a bigger part of the journey of Christian stewardship at Zion.



In August, the pantry served 200 families which included 267 children, 390 adults, and 97 seniors for a total of 754 people served. We registered 13 new families.



During the month of August, Zion members donated 121 pounds of food. Thank you to our Zion members for the great contribution of fresh produce from your gardens! Thank you for your continued giving of financial contributions to the pantry! These monies are used to purchase food items on sale at various grocery stores and the Central Penn Food Bank.

The pantry "welcomed" Hempfield Church of the Brethren as a new contributor.

During the month of August....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 2,240 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Target in Lititz donated 1,664 pounds of fresh produce and bakery items; Weis Markets in Columbia donated 833 pounds of



bread and bakery items; Weis Market Stony Battery Road donated 213 pounds of bread and bakery items. Penn State Extension donated 1,023 pounds of fresh produce. Other food donated through stores, food drives, individual churches, and private donations totaled 6,163 pounds of food for the month of August.

We continue to be blessed with many volunteers from the Hempfield area and 20 Hempfield community churches who work together giving of their time to the pantry each Monday and Wednesday as well as additional time as needed. 74 volunteers gave 744 hours during the month of August.
