There are some extra items (soap, clippers, combs and toothbrushes) in a basket which you may use to complete your kit! When you have everything needed for one kit, place the bag in the collection chest across from the mailboxes.



These kits are sent all over the world to provide necessary supplies and comfort to refugees. Please take the following list with you when you shop. Each item is specific in size, shape, or style!

in each Personal Care Kit:	
One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended	
Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars	
One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*	
 One sturdy comb. There are many different types of hair texture, so no picks or fine-toothed combs; remove packaging 	•
 One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging 	
*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags




ADULT SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL: 10:15 a.m. ...IN THE PARLOR
