A Note From The Council President, Adele King:

At the Council meeting in March we were originally going to meet with Pastor Jorgensen to go over the congregational vitality survey. Unfortunately, at the last minute, he was unable to attend the meeting, and so that discussion has been postponed until the April meeting. Instead, we had quite a few other business items which we focused our meeting around.

We reviewed our goals for the year and put them into SMART form (**S**pecific, **M**easurable, **A**chievable, **R**esults-focused, and **T**ime-bound). In addition, the Personnel team proposed a schedule change for the sextons over the summer, as well as staff participation in workshops and seminars relevant to their positions.

An IT team has been formed and they will be meeting to discuss and evaluate our needs regarding internet accessibility in the church building. The Food Pantry committee has made an offer to pay 50% of the costs related to this since reliable internet access is essential to the work they do too.

On Maundy Thursday, the Church Council hosted the community meal so we coordinated plans to make this a successful and delish meal for those who attended.

As you know by now, the HVAC system has been upgraded and so the expense of this has now been paid and therefore, is reflected in the financial report. Even though we had one of our most successful pledge drives last year, we are falling way beneath our giving expectations. In fact, we gave \$6,000 less in January 2018 than we did in January 2017. And, in February, we were \$7,000 less in 2018 than in 2017. These are disturbing figures, I am sure you would agree, and hopefully this trend will not continue. (Cont'd on pg. 2)

-Who is Jesus?


-How does Jesus help me each and every day?


-How do I teach my children about Jesus?

Fearless Generosity

So many times in our adult lives we try to solve problems or explain our actions in our lives with our adult way of thinking and reasoning which many times is more difficult and complicated than it really is. Sometimes if we just listened to or watched a child react to a problem, we would see how simple and straight forward the solution could be.

Children can teach us a thing or two about Christian stewardship because they do not have preconceived ideas or notions. We can also learn that they are never too young to learn the principles of stewardship.

The Our Daily Bread devotion for February 26, 2018 written by Xochitl Dixon is a fine example of the lessons we can learn from a child. I have reprinted the article below.

Fearless Giving

When my son Xavier was six years old, a friend brought her toddler to visit and Xavier wanted to give him a few toys. I delighted in our little giver's generosity, until he offered a stuffed animal my husband had searched several stores in different cities to find. Recognizing the high-demand toy, my friend tried to politely decline. Still, Xavier placed his gift into her son's hands and said, "My daddy

gives me lots of toys to share."

Though I'd like to say Xavier learned his confident giving from me, I've often withheld my resources from God and others. But when I remember that my heavenly Father gives me everything I have and need, it's easier to share.

In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to trust Him by giving a portion of all He had supplied to the Levite priests, who would in turn help others in need. When the people refused, the prophet Malachi said they were robbing the Lord (Malachi 3:8-9). But if they gave willingly, showing they trusted the Lord's promised provision and protection (vv. 10 -11), others would recognize them as God's blessed people (v. 12).

Whether we're managing our finances, our schedules, or the gifts God entrusted to us, giving can be an act of worship.

Giving freely and fearlessly can show our confidence in the care of our loving Father-the ultimate generous giver.

Food Pantry Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In March the pantry served 146 families of which 188 were children; 345 adults: 75 seniors for a total 608 persons served. Clients may visit the pantry once a week, either Monday or Wednesday...an average of 100 families visit the pantry each week.

"Thank you" to our Zion members who contributed 162 pounds of food items to the pantry during the month of March. "Thank you" to the Zion members who continue to contribute financially to the pantry. Monetary contributions help the pantry to purchase food items not regularly donated as meats, eggs in addition to the purchase of "high demand" items as cereal, rice, peanut butter, ielly, canned vegetables, soups, and fruits. Financial contributions also allow the pantry to purchase food items at the Central Penn Food Bank at eighteen cents per pound.

Requested food items for April are: 24 oz. cans spaghetti sauce, macaroni and cheese, cereal, 15 oz. canned corn, 15 oz. canned tomatoes, canned pineapple.

During the month of March....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 1,584 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Giant Mount Joy donated 316 pounds of bread and bakery items and 140 pounds of food items; Weis Market in Columbia donated 467 pounds of bread and bakery items; Weis Market **Stony Battery Road donated 273** bakery items and 211 pounds meat products; S. Clyde Weaver

donated 80 pounds of bakery item; Stauffers of Rohrerstown donated 40 pounds of food items. The pantry purchased 4,109 pounds of food from the Central Penn Food Bank and 720 pounds from local grocery stores. The pantry received 2,425 pounds of free food items from Community Action Program. In addition to the above donations and purchases, 10,139 pounds came from the community which includes donations from the churches, schools, businesses, social and civic organizations and private individuals. March monthly total of pounds of food items purchased/donated was 18,620 pounds!!!

Included in the pounds donated in March was 4,724 pounds of food items through the Hempfield School District's annual food drive....elementary, middle and high school students and staff. J. K. Mechanical, a sponsor of the school district, provided the transportation, collection and man power to deliver the food to the pantry!

Fifty eight volunteers gave 465 hours during the month of March. The pantry is a complete volunteer effort, operating with a full non-paid staff. Many volunteers work "behind the scenes" on days other than "open" days of Monday and Wednesday. There are "pickups" of staples, fresh produce. and bakery items made throughout the week at the various businesses. In addition, there is an office staff documenting the dona-



tions received, clients served and completing other required reports for the Central Penn Food Bank, and registering new clients each week. We could not provide this important community service without our volunteers! Our clients are very appreciative of the time the volunteers willingly give to serving with a true servant's heart and a smile! Currently, the Hempfield Area Food Pantry has over 300 families registered to receive food assistance. Ninety percent of the clients served at the pantry reside in the Hempfield School District. The remaining families reside in bordering communities. In addition to the clients who visit the pantry to select their food items. deliveries are made to senior citizens, and families who are unable to get to the pantry due to physical disabilities, lack of transportation, or those who no longer drive. All of our clients are very thankful and appreciative for the assistance they receive during this stressful and difficult economic time in their lives.

AND, the pantry would not be able to provide this program to the Hempfield residents without the outreach mission of Zion with the use of God's property. This mission is a witness of God's hands, feet, heart, and love in action!
