PERSONAL CARE KITS UPDATE & SHIPPING COST

BRICK POINTING IN PROGRESS

Work has started on the Social Hall Walls! Brick pointing will be done on Zion's old bell tower and social hall walls through this month. Scaffolding has already been erected and work will begin shortly. The mortar joints on much of the outside walls are over 100 years old and have deteriorated. The loose mortar in the joints will be ground out and refilled with new. Once this is done the outside walls will be sprayed with a sealant that will prevent



water from penetrating. The work is being done by Krimmel Contracting. Krimmel is a multi-generational family-owned masonry contractor with excellent references from local churches.

MONTHLY MESSAGE FROM YOUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Please note that all teams could use "new ideas" and, as you read through these updates, prayerfully consider where you could be of assistance.

- Your Executive Team, along with the help of our Parish Administrator and Council Secretary, has completed the constitution and bylaws updates, and is beginning work on our church policies. They also guide Council whenever an issue comes up.
- Your Finance Team is busy putting together a budget. They are planning an informational meeting for the congregation on October 30.
- Members of the ReVitalization team attended a webinar in relationship with Fall Stewardship and updates to Simply Giving. They are moving toward more Temple Talks and updates in the newsletter and bulletin announcements.
- As part of the Care/Fellowship Team, The Men of Zion held a beautiful and nourishing picnic at Lake Grubb. For Rally Day on September 18, the team held an informative session on the history of Zion and a breakfast.
- Your Property Team has been working on live-streaming issues, specifically related to the camera and microphones. Additionally, the team has been trying to locate leaks in our roof over the kitchen area. Updates to our network server is also warranted and Council approved funds to do that.
- Your Social Outreach Team has had COBYS come and present details of their program. Additionally, the Community Meal has started up again under the leadership of Mary Hetrick. Plans are being made for the Crop Walk on October 16.
- Your Worship and Music Team looked at possible changes to the service and has decided to keep things as is for now. Kim Paternoster agreed to oversee decorating for special services and occasions. After hearing more information about the Thrivent Action program from Ann Seitz-Brown, suggestions for programs and initiatives have been discussed. There has also been discussion about when to host concerts. In addition, the live-streaming issues have been discussed.
- The Personnel Team is working on salary recommendations for employees, while updating job descriptions.




