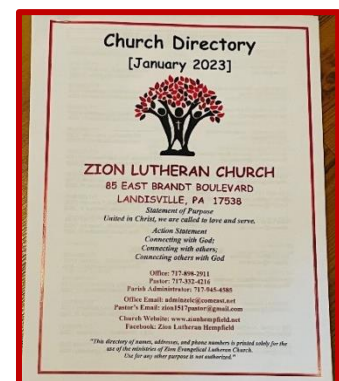
PSU BASKETBALL GAME WITH MEN OF ZION

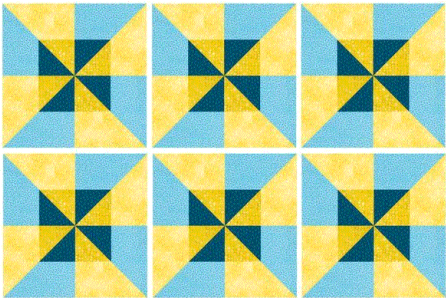

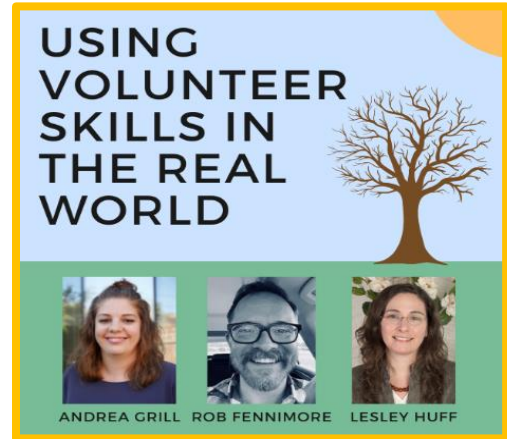

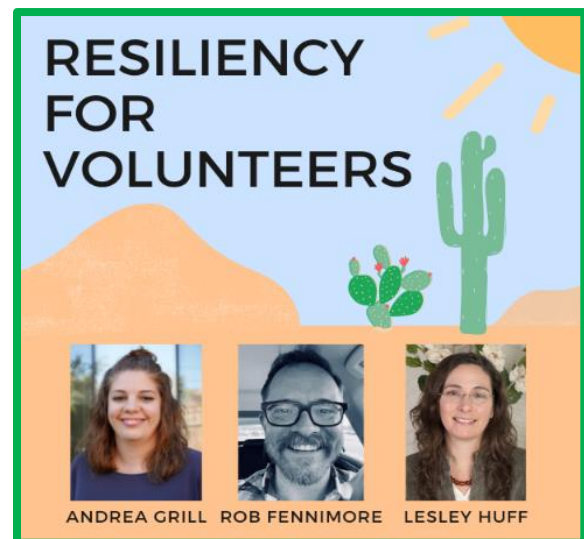
