

## IN CASE YOU MISSED IT LAST SUNDAY ...

Al Ramer shared a Temple Talk on behalf of the Stewardship Team. If you didn't hear it or need a reminder of what he mentioned, his manuscript follows:

I'll begin by asking you to look around the sanctuary. What is different?

Nearly two years ago when we introduced the reVITALization and VITALization initiatives, we had 20 to 30 attendees. Today we typically have 60 to 80.

You first had an opportunity to recognize members who offered their time. Then many shared biographical information and talents. We had fun guessing who you were based on the information you shared. Most recently we addressed finishing 2023 strong with your treasure offerings as this year's budget was determined and approved. You now receive a monthly condensed financial report that started in September.

Bringing us to where we are today would not have been possible without each of your individual VITAL contributions of time, talent, and treasure. I want to recognize and personally thank Denise Haun, my wife Diane, Dave Wise, Dave Wauls, Randy Miller, John Hay, Phil Houseal, Lisa Nelson, Anne Rankin, and Pastor Tim for their support, ideas, and extra time commitment needed to bring us to today. We now have a solid foundation to move forward.

Today I'm introducing our next congregational initiative. The Generosity Initiative will work over the next three years to build long-term financial security and congregational growth. The two core goals are to eliminate our financial dependence on the endowment earnings and gifts and, make the community outside these walls aware of how we are changing people's lives with our support of the food pantry, the community meals, and our support of the non-profit organizations that we contribute to.

The Barna Group is a Christian research organization that provides data and insights on the trends affecting faith, culture, and ministry today. They conducted research in 2022 that showed that younger generations want to be part of groups that are having an impact changing people's life. We are doing that inside these walls with our support of the food pantry and our community meals and outside these walls with our support of local non-profit organizations. Not surprisingly, the research showed that the baby boomers don't understand what those born since 1965 view as important to their participation and giving. For many of us, that means we need to adjust our mindset. For example, just having a contemporary service or other programs we think relate to that age group will not necessarily make them want to come here. We can <u>differentiate</u> ourselves by demonstrating that we are a worship community that not only changes lives within these walls but, just as important to the younger generations, we are making an impact and changing lives outside these walls.

That describes a primary group that the Barna research determined those under 60 want to belong and contribute to. Making a difference in the greater community becomes even more important the younger the age group. With us, they can make a difference and positively impact the greater community.

Over the next three years, if each one of us can contribute on average, \$5 or more per week, we can eliminate our dependency on earnings from our trust fund and gifts. As that happens, we can increase our support of deserving non-profits to help them help impact lives for the better. With a Faith Sharing or evangelism effort that makes known what we are doing for the greater community, we can gain the attention of younger generations to decide more readily to "Come and See" who we are and learn more about what we are doing. The goal is to add **five** new members each year.

We are calling this three-year initiative the Generosity Initiative. Repeating what I just said, your generosity will allow us to increase Zions generosity outside these walls and, in additional ways, address the needs of the congregation inside these walls. As the greater community learns more about Zion, they will more readily decide to "Come and See" who we are and what we are doing inside these walls.

This will be a challenging process. You have already shown, post Covid, the difference it makes when each of us recognizes that we are VITAL contributors as we use our time, talent and treasures given to us by God and use them in God-pleasing ways.

In Matthew 19:26, Jesus looked at his disciples and said, "With human beings this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

In this season of Lent, I ask you to prayerfully ask God what you can do to build upon the foundation of giving that we have established these past two years as we <u>all</u> work together to make the Generosity Initiative a success that is pleasing to God.

## **SHARING OUR TREASURES: March Update**

In the month of February, our expenses came in under budget by \$5,645 – a positive accomplishment! Of this, \$2,416 can be attributed to a reduction in maintenance costs under the property expense category, \$880 under the administration category, and \$1,232 under the worship and music category. The remaining \$1,100 is an accumulation of ministries and committees with amounts budgeted but no expenses incurred.

While the expenses were maintained under control, the portion of the budget that we as the congregation can control fell disappointingly short by \$6,296 (as compared to February 2023). On the bright side however, our February income did exceed January's income by \$4,410.

With the emphasis this year on generous giving, we all can—and should—give prayerful consideration to how we will respond to God's gifts to us and love for us. In his Temple Talk, Al Ramer talks about the role each of us plays in continuing to build upon the stewardship foundation we have worked on over the past two years. In the spirit of the stewardship emphasis this year, let us each be challenged by the call to give generously.

"We should certainly count our blessings, but perhaps more importantly, we should also make our blessings count."




