


CAPTURE THE FLAG SPECTACULAR

FROM THE CALL COMMITTEE

Just a note to let you know that your Call Committee is still active.

Although we have not met with any candidates since the last update, and do not currently have any forthcoming, we do have some positive news. The committee met with Bishop Dunlop and Assistant to the Bishop Martini last week. They were kind enough to come to Zion. Pastor Martini is the Synod representative who we have been working with during this call process.

The meeting was very productive and they are both very personable. They assured us that Zion is a priority and will continue to be. We discussed the call process in general, Zion's process, and some of the related factors. It is a fact that the number of pastors who are seeking a call is in short supply. This is true not only in our Synod, but the larger Lutheran church as well. A positive note is that the Lower Susquehanna Synod seems to be a desirable destination for pastors seeking a call. Another factor affecting the supply is that many pastors are reluctant to leave their current congregation as we hopefully begin to recover from the pandemic, despite this recent surge. This is certainly understandable.

During the next several weeks, the committee will meet to update some of the information in Zion's profile that has changed since it was written. Meanwhile, the committee continues to be prayerfully hopeful that our diligence and patience, along with Synod support, will culminate in attracting a new spiritual leader for Zion.
