In case you're wondering about the results of the Congregational Vitality Survey that was completed by the congregation in January, stay tuned for more information about those results in the May newsletter.


May you continue to seek ways to involve others in our worship and ask God's help in the growth of our church!



Whether it is investments, life insurance, or some other product, there are many members of Zion who currently hold Thrivent products in their financial portfolio. One of the nice benefits of being a Thrivent member is that you have the ability to use monies that are available through Thrivent's Action Team program for projects and activities at the church.

It is my understanding that Zion has enough Thrivent members who could generate an additional \$50,000.00 in income to Zion that is available through the program. Many of our members have already filed for an Action Team project (2 per person are available each year at \$250.00 per request), and used the money for the following purposes:

Lisa Nelson: Kids Club for supplies and food

Randy Miller: Mission trip to Zion for supplies

Dave Wise: Nursery School celebration supplies

Linda Bear: Stephen Ministry for food and presenter remuneration

Jim Bear: Thursday evening meals for food

Cathy Benedict: Mom's House, Corner of Hope, ELCA World Hunger, wheelchair for Luther Acres, large print bibles, school supplies for Lancaster homeless, Alzheimer's memory walk, Heifer International

Millie Gundel: Supplies for Comforters & Pantry Christmas gift bags

As you can see, the types of projects are varied and can cover different needs. I am sure that, as a congregation, we can think of more projects where Thrivent money could be used (VBS is an example). Since we have trouble meeting our budget every year, the money available from Thrivent could provide additional much needed funds for our outreach programs.



Living In The Word, Bible Study

Each Sunday morning, we are immersed in The Word of God. Not only do we wade into the written Word and spoken word through the reading of scriptures and the sermon, we also encounter the sung Word through the songs and hymns. The living Word comes to us as Jesus' body and blood through the bread and wine of Holy Communion and as the Holy Spirit through the water and promises of Holy Baptism.

What many Lutheran worshippers may not realize, life-long Lutheran or not, is that virtually every word of our traditional liturgy is taken from scripture. From the Confession to the Benediction at the end of the service, we are living in the Word through our worship. What we say, sing and hear on Sunday mornings is ALL bible-based.


Contemporary worship in the Lutheran setting is, also, focused on the Word. In addition to the Creed (when said) and the Lord's Prayer, elements of "contemporary worship" such as the Call to Worship and the Benediction may be drawn from scripture. For instance, the Call to Worship

may be the words of or based on a Psalm- often the Psalm appointed for the day.

Have you ever wondered why the words used in worship seem familiar? It's because you may have encountered them in the Holy Bible.

Here's a suggestion: Take a copy of the Sunday Bulletin home with you to reference during the week. As you read the Bible during your daily devotions, watch for scriptural phrases that occur in our liturgy. Another idea is to do a scripture search on various parts of the liturgy to find the sources of what we say or sing. In addition, watch for scriptural references in the hymns and songs we sing each week. Not only will you be living in the Word on Sundays but also throughout the week.

Food Pantry Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In February the pantry served 145 families of which 194 were children; 348 adults: 81 seniors for a total 623 persons served. Clients may visit the pantry once a week, either Monday or Wednesday...an average of 100 families visit the pantry each week.

"Thank you" to our Zion members who contributed 135 pounds of food items to the pantry during the month of February. "Thank you" to the Zion members who contributed financially to the pantry in February. Monetary contributions help the pantry to purchase food items not regularly donated as meats, eggs in addition to the purchase of "high demand" items as cereal, rice, peanut butter, jelly, canned vegetables, soups, and fruits. Financial contributions also allow the pantry to purchase food items at the Central Penn Food Bank at eighteen cents per pound.

Requested food items for March are: Natural peanut butter 18 oz.. canned red beets 15 oz., canned carrots 15 oz., canned tomatoes 15 oz., Old Fashioned oatmeal.

During the month of February....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 1.243 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Giant Mount Joy donated 343 pounds of bread and bakery items and 211 pounds of food items: Weis Market in Columbia donated 784 pounds of bread and bakery items; Weis Market

Stony Battery Road donated 508 bakery items and 177 pounds meat products; S. Clyde Weaver donated 97 pounds of bakery item; Stauffers of Rohrerstown donated 96 pounds of food items. The pantry purchased 8,060 pounds of food from the Central Penn Food Bank and 1.020 pounds from local grocery stores. The pantry received 2,889 pounds of free food items from Community Action Program. In addition to the above donations and purchases, 6,029 pounds came from the community which includes donations from the churches, schools, businesses, social and civic organizations and private individuals. February monthly total of pounds of food items purchased/donated was 19,785 pounds!!!

Sixty one volunteers gave 572 hours during the month of February. The pantry is a complete volunteer effort, operating with a full nonpaid staff. Many volunteers work "behind the scenes" on days other than "open" days of Monday and Wednesday. There are "pickups" of staples, fresh produce, and bakery items made throughout the week at the various businesses. In addition, there is an office staff documenting the donations received, clients served and completing other required reports for the Central Penn Food Bank, and registering new clients each week. We could not provide this important community service without our volunteers! Our clients are very appreciative of the time the volunteers willingly



give to serving with a true servant's heart and a smile! Currently, the Hempfield Area Food Pantry has over 300 families registered to receive food assistance. Ninety percent of the clients served at the pantry reside in the Hempfield School District. The remaining families reside in bordering communities. In addition to the clients who visit the pantry to select their food items, deliveries are made to senior citizens, and families who are unable to get to the pantry due to physical disabilities, lack of transportation, or those who no longer drive. All of our clients are very thankful and appreciative for the assistance they receive during this stressful and difficult economic time in their lives.

AND, the pantry would not be able to provide this program to the Hempfield residents without the outreach mission of Zion with the use of God's property. This mission is a witness of God's hands, feet, heart, and love in action!
