

From the Pastor's Keyboard: "Say What?"

How would you respond if someone contacts you and exclaims, "I have a wonderful opportunity for you!" Would you delete the email, or immediately hang up your phone? Would you consider the message SPAM or a scam? Most people would react negatively to the claim of the sender or caller, wouldn't they?

Here's another possible response: you'd request an explanation or a clarification of the "wonderful opportunity" and listen to the response. Then your decision would be based on greater knowledge of the veracity of the claim, right? So, how about this scenario: when you ask the person for more information, he/she responds, "to be specific, this wonderful opportunity is for you to talk about Jesus and his impact on your life to someone who doubts or doesn't believe." Now, how would you respond to the invitation?

The sad truth is that most Lutheran Christians would either say no (thank you) and end the conversation or give a multitude of reasons he or she wasn't able to talk "Jesus talk." As a result, the person really has missed a wonderful opportunity for putting personal faith into words. Actions of care and service are easy and comfortable for us Lutherans, but don't make us tell others about the Jesus we worship and why.

While serving my first congregation, a parishioner came to talk with me. She told me that when I started as their pastor, she was uncomfortable with all my "Jesus talk" outside of worship. Then she followed by explaining that she had gotten used to my "Jesus talk" over time. In fact, and to her surprise, she'd found herself talking about Jesus too, even outside the church building! She said, "I guess you rubbed off on me!" (Cont'd on pg. 2)

From the Pastor. (Cont'd), Mt. Gretna Events

The lesson of this little story is two-fold:

- Her increased ability to share her faith had nothing to do with me, her pastor. It had everything to do with the work of the Holy Spirit within her to bring her faith to greater maturity.
- Being in a community of faith where members are actively talking "Jesus talk" or sharing their faith in Jesus is an important means of spiritual growth for the entire community.

Talking about life and faith affects both the speaker and the listener. The speaker becomes more comfortable with and more confident about sharing faith. The listener's faith is bolstered in hearing faith testimonies of others. The listener becomes more comfortable when others use "Jesus talk," even out-

side of the church. The listener has found a model or teacher of faith-sharing. Most important, the Holy Spirit works within these faith conversations to encourage the listener to share his faith, also. This process may take time and lots of practice, but the more we share our individual faith lives with others, the greater our witness as a congregation will be to the community around us.

We have a wonderful opportunity as a congregationto encourage one another to share faith through our "Jesus talk" of love, forgiveness, acceptance and hope. At the end of our services we say, "We will!" in response to the commissioning to "Go share the Gospel." Let's truly mean what we say.





• Council Update Submitted by Adele King

At the April Council meeting, Pastor Jorgensen (Assistant to the Bishop) reported on the results of the congregational vitality survey that was taken in January. It is difficult to explain the results from the survey in just a few words, however, some positive points to highlight include the fact that we see ourselves as a positive force in the community, we have a real presence of God in our daily lives, and most initiatives are started by the people within the congregation.

Conversely, it is evident that while there are these positive aspects of the ministry at Zion, we are also facing many challenges; there is an underlying tension in our social climate that seems to weave itself through a variety of aspects of what we do and how we do what we do it.

Because of these points, we are currently a viable congregation, but we are not sustainable or vital for the long run. To address this reality, Pastor Jorgensen suggested that we set up a team of 6-8 members to work with the synod on becoming a healthy congregation. We will need to focus on our relationship with God and with each other. We will need to rely on scripture and prayer and we all must be willing to adapt and change. Pastor Jorgensen assured us that God is not done with us!! Similar to how he met with the Council, Pastor Jorgensen has also met with the ministry

team leaders to review the survey with them.

The search for a new Director of Music and Worship Arts is going well; to date, we have received 33 applicants. The Team met on May 14th to select which of those applicants to follow up with and to potentially interview.

The Property Team is in the process of replacing 4 road signs advertising our church and continues to look into other improvements to our church building.

Jeff Engroff reports that planning for VBS is going well and will be held July 9-12 from 6-8 PM each night. If you are interested in helping, please let him know.

You should be aware that we have, since Sept., 2017, spent \$61,000 from the Betty Lou Hoffman funds. We thank God for her generosity and hope you will think of her example and remember the church when you are doing your own estate planning.

Please remember to continuously and intentionally think evangelically---spread the good news of our Lord to all that you can, by words and actions. Pray for your Council as we strive to move this church forward.



Food Pantry Submitted by Diane Gerlach

In April the pantry served 145 families of which 188 were children; 358 adults: 78 seniors for a total 624 persons served. Clients may visit the pantry once a week, either Monday or Wednesday...an average of 75-100 families visit the pantry each week.

"Thank you" to our Zion members who contributed 44 pounds of food items to the pantry during the month of April. "Thank you" to the Zion members who continue to contribute financially to the pantry. Monetary contributions help the pantry to purchase food items not regularly donated as meats, eggs in addition to the purchase of "high demand" items as cereal, rice, peanut butter, ielly, canned vegetables, soups, and fruits. Financial contributions also allow the pantry to purchase food items at the Central Penn Food Bank once a month at greatly reduced prices.

Requested food items for June are: 24 oz. cans spaghetti sauce, cereal, canned pineapple, 18 oz. strawberry jelly, boxed pasta, and chunky peanut butter

During the month of April....Darrenkamps of Mount Joy donated 2,088 pounds of fresh produce to the pantry; Giant Mount Joy donated 509 pounds of bread and bakery items and 595 pounds of food items; Weis Market in Columbia donated 590 pounds of bread and bakery items; Weis Market

Stony Battery Road donated 467 bakery items and 211 pounds meat products; S. Clyde Weaver donated 121 pounds of bakery item: Stauffers of Rohrerstown donated 46 pounds of food items. The pantry purchased 5,209 pounds of food from the Central Penn Food Bank and 1,053 pounds from local grocery stores. The pantry received 2,546 pounds of free food items from Community Action Program. In addition to the above donations and purchases. 6.069 pounds came from the community which includes donations from the churches, schools, businesses, social and civic organizations and private individuals. April monthly total of pounds of food items purchased/donated was 16,675 pounds!!!

Sixty seven volunteers gave 693 hours during the month of April. The pantry is a complete volunteer effort, operating with a full non-paid staff. Many volunteers work "behind the scenes" on days other than "open" days of Monday and Wednesday. There are "pickups" of staples, fresh produce, and bakery items made throughout the week at the various businesses. In addition, there is an office staff documenting the donations received, clients served and completing other required reports for the Central Penn Food Bank, and registering new clients each week. We could not provide this important community service without our volun-

teers! Our clients are very appreciative of the time the volunteers willingly



give to serving with a true servant's heart and a smile! Currently, the Hempfield Area Food Pantry has over 300 families registered to receive food assistance. Ninety percent of the clients served at the pantry reside in the Hempfield School District. The remaining families reside in bordering communities. In addition to the clients who visit the pantry to select their food items, deliveries are made to senior citizens, and families who are unable to get to the pantry due to physical disabilities, lack of transportation, or those who no longer drive. All of our clients are very thankful and appreciative for the assistance they receive during this stressful and difficult economic time in their lives.

AND, the pantry would not be able to provide this program to the Hempfield residents without the outreach mission of Zion with the use of God's property. This mission is a witness of God's hands, feet, heart, and love in action!

Stop by to visit the community pantry "in action" any Monday or Wednesday morning or see Diane Gerlach for a tour. Thank you! Together we will feed the hungry!
