





 - ¹³ The LORD looks down from heaven, and sees all humankind.
 - ¹⁴God sits firmly enthroned and watches all who dwell on the earth.
 - ¹⁵ God fashions all their hearts and observes all their deeds.
 - ¹⁶ A king is not saved by the size of the army, nor are warriors rescued by their great strength.
 - ¹⁷ The horse gives vain hope for victory; despite its great strength it cannot save.
 - ¹⁸ Truly, your eye is upon those who fear you, O LORD, upon those who wait for your steadfast love,
 - ¹⁹ to deliver their lives from death, and to keep them alive in time of famine.

HEBREWS 11:1-3, 8-16

A model for us: Abraham's faith in a new home given by God.

- A: ¹ Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ² Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. ³ By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.
 - ⁸ By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. ⁹ By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. ¹⁰ For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. ¹¹ By faith he received power of procreation, even though he

was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. ¹² Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, "as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore."

¹³ All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, ¹⁴ for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. ¹⁵ If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. ¹⁶ But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.



All baptized Christians are welcome to partake of the Holy Sacrament. Those who do not or choose not to partake of the sacrament may receive a blessing.



In addition, 49 individuals volunteered 599 hours and 51 pounds of food items were donated.
