


Silence is kept for reflection.







ISAIAH 58:9b-14

Do not trample the sabbath, but feed the hungry.

A: ^{9b} If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, ¹⁰ if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. ¹¹ The LORD will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. ¹² Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in.

You have come to the city of the living God and to Jesus.

A: ¹⁸ You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, ¹⁹ and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. ²⁰ (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." ²¹ Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") ²² But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, ²³ and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, ²⁴ and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

⁴ who redeems your life from the grave and crowns you with steadfast love and mercy;

⁵ who satisfies your desires with good things so that your youth is renewed like an eagle's.

⁶O LORD, you provide vindication and justice for all who are oppressed.

⁷ You made known your ways to Moses and your works to the children of Israel.

⁸ LORD, you are full of compassion and mercy, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love.

²⁵ See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! ²⁶ At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." ²⁷ This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. ²⁸ Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe: ²⁹ for indeed our God is a consuming fire.



She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. 12 When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." 13 When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. 14 But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." 15 But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath untie his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? 16 And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" 17 When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.






PARTAKING IN THE BREAD AND CUP OF SALVATION

All baptized Christians are welcome to partake of the Holy Sacrament. Those who do not or choose not to partake of the sacrament may receive a blessing.





When clients move in to their home, they are given a cleaning bucket filled with supplies. With 2-3 move-ins every Saturday, that means 8-12 buckets are distributed each month. This year's Rally Day Project focuses on supporting OTS with this part of their work in the community by providing requested items for the buckets. Due to the fact that the buckets are a certain size (10-quart) only certain sized items can be included. *Please only purchase exactly what is listed below.* 25 buckets have already been purchased with Thrivent grant money.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Thank you for the 283 pounds of cereal that was donated to the Hempfield Area Food Pantry in July as well as for the financial contributions! Monetary contributions help to purchase food (such as eggs, fresh produce, meats, and dairy products) at the Central Penn Food Bank, local grocery stores, and markets at deep discounts. Last month, the pantry served 2,254 individuals (673 children; 1,117 adults; 464 seniors) and is grateful for the 49 people who volunteered 675 hours.
