

GENERAL INFORMATION

WELCOME TO ZION! We are glad you have chosen to worship with us in-person or online today! The service contains the four parts of the Lutheran liturgy (The Gathering, The Word, The Meal, and The Sending). WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AT ZION

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning. On September3, the service will be held outdoors.

ONLINE: Indoor worship services are live-streamed on the church YouTube channel: http://bit.ly/Zion_Live. If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. When the service is held outdoors, there will be no live-stream.

FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

- * Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the Narthex and in the hallway off the back door. <u>Infant changing tables</u> can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- ❖ Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. There are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the Parlor as a cry room while also still being able to listen to the service.


INTRODUCTION




Children like hearing the same story over and over as a way to master all of the emotional experience. Adults retell difficult stories for similar reasons.


Retelling stories lets us re-process, and re-organize them in our mind. Sometimes the kindest thing we can do for someone is listen well to stories we have heard before.

Peter has been gifted with this revelation!


