

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AT ZION

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning. On September 5, worship will be held outdoors on the Cooper House lawn. Rally Day is scheduled for September 12.

ONLINE: Worship services are live-streamed on the church YouTube channel: <u>http://bit.ly/Zion_Live</u>. If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. Services held outdoors will not be live-streamed.

- Communion is distributed in continuous fashion or you may take one of the communion kits at the back of the Sanctuary if you prefer to commune at your seat.
- Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the Narthex and in the hallway off the back door.
- Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. There are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available.
- Ushers are located near the front and back of the worship area to direct people to seating and to the offering plates.

THE GREATEST BREAD

Jesus uses the image of bread to demonstrate that, even compared to all the great things God has done before, God's greatest miracle is in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Jesus, the bread of life, is a greater miracle than the manna God sent in the dessert (Exod. 16:14), greater than the bread the angel brought to restore Elijah (1 Kings 19:4-8), greater even than the loaves Jesus had just multiplied to feed a crowd of more than five thousand people (John 6:1-14)! In Jesus, God gives bread for the journey—not only for this life, but also into eternal life.

We're so familiar with this image that it loses some of its original power. But the claim Jesus is making here is a radical one—and a dangerous one. To Jesus' original audience, his claim to be the bread from heaven, the Son of God, must have sounded like outrageous blasphemy. "Is not this Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know?" they say. "How can he now say, 'I have come down from heaven'?" (John 6:42). Who does this guy think he is?

Jesus' message is both outrageous and outrageously comforting: anyone who eats this bread will live forever. The Son of God meets us in this life and gives us real and certain hope for eternal life. Normal bread is amazing in its own right; manna is miraculous. But Jesus Christ is the true bread and the greatest miracle of all. "Taste and see that the LORD is good" (Ps. 34:8).



IMAGES IN THE READINGS

Sunday is truth-telling time. Today, **hunger and thirst** are images for the essential human condition. We pray that, living in Christ, we will never be thirsty again. See Evangelical Lutheran Worship's Thanksgiving at the Font V (p. 71) to join with the Samaritan woman.

In art, most **angels** are inadequate depictions of the identity as manifestations of the power and mercy of God. Angels are the way humans encounter God. Because angels surround God like a nimbus, they not only convey God's will but also perpetually praise God. Because angels are extensions of God, they protect, feed, guide, judge.

The author of Ephesians uses traditional religious categories to interpret Christ's crucifixion when he writes about "a fragrant offering and sacrifice." In Israelite religion until the destruction of the temple in 70 CE and in many other world religions, animals are killed as symbols of the giving of oneself in repentance or praise to the deity. Countering the stink that accompanies such rituals, incense was also burned, thus symbolizing that one's worship of the divine was sweet and rendered the world sweet. Early Christians needed to find ways to understand the execution of the Messiah, and Christians are so accustomed to the description of Jesus' death as a sacrifice that we seldom meditate on the oddness of the image. Surely the destruction of the temple contributed to the acceptance of this imagery. Most profound religious imagery is odd.

In the Bible, God is praised for having miraculously fed the people a strange food, **manna**. To show to Christians the meaning of this manna for them, some depictions in medieval art show this manna as communion hosts that the Israelites are gathering up off the ground.

SUMMER PROJECT - "PERSONAL CARE KIT"

We continue to collect personal care items for Lutheran World Relief (LWR). Items purchased can be put in the bin in the Narthex across from the mailboxes. These kits, when completed, will be sent all over the world wherever there is a need.

Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended
- Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging*
- One sturdy comb (no picks or fine toothed combs); remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap When you have purchased <u>every</u> item needed for <u>one kit</u>, place the bagful in the collection box near the mailboxes. At the end of the summer, we will have a "kit assembly party" when we open each bag, assemble the kits as per LWR instructions, and pack them in cartons to ship. We have a goal of 50 kits! Can we do more than that?
