

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AT ZION

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning.

If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. When the service is held outdoors, there will be no live-stream.

FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

- * Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- ❖ Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. There are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the parlor as a cry room while also still being able to listen to the service.
- ❖ <u>Ushers</u> are located near the front and back of the worship area to direct people to seating, assist with other matters, and to answer questions.
- ❖ <u>Mask wearing</u> is optional for all who attend or participate in indoor gatherings, including worship, at the church.

INTRODUCTION

Isaiah calls us all to be heralds with John, to lift up our voices fearlessly and say, "See, your God is coming!" We say it to one another in worship, in order to say it with our lives in a world in need of justice and peace.





After Jesus cast out the unclean spirits and the unclean spirits tried to tell everyone he was the Messiah, "Jesus gave the unclean spirits strict orders not to tell anyone about him."

- L/J: Why did the unclean spirits try to tell everyone that Jesus was the Messiah? We thought the unclean spirits were against Jesus.
- P: Because Jesus knew that the unclean spirits would try to mislead everyone in understanding <u>how</u> Jesus was the Messiah. We always want a Messiah who says "We're Number One!" and "We get to boss everyone around!" But Jesus is the Messiah who says, "Anyone who wants to be first must be last and the servant of all."
- L/J: We light the first two Advent candles as a reminder that Jesus casts out our unclean spirits of wanting to always be first and the boss of others. Let us pray. Come, Lord Jesus. Come quickly and cast out any unclean spirit in us and renew us with your Holy Spirit so that we might seek to become first and greatest by becoming the servant of all. Amen.

IN THE NAME OF OUR LO

When our Lord and Master Jesus Christ said, "Repent" (Matthew 4:17), he willed the entire life of believers to be one of repentance.

This word cannot be understood as referring to the sacrament or penance, that is, confession and satisfaction, as administered by the clergy.

Yet it does not mean solely inner repentance; such inner repentance is worthless unless it produces various outward mortification of the flesh.






4. WHAT THEN IS THE SIGNIFICANCE OF SUCH A BAPTISM WITH WATER?

NICENE CREED

P: Let us profess our faith together.


PARTAKING IN THE BREAD AND CUP OF SALVATION




Please use this time for quiet reflection or join in singing the communion hymns until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seats.



FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Thank you, Zion, for contributing 97 pound of food in October! The pantry is also grateful for financial contributions that help to purchase food items at the Central Penn Food Bank in Harrisburg at below super market costs. Financial contributions also allow the managers to purchase food items at local grocery stores and markets such as eggs, fresh produce, meats, dairy products as well as other pantry supplies.

In October, the pantry served a total of 1,956 people (544 children, 950 adults, 462 seniors, and 18 new families). Without the 40 volunteers who served over 600 hours, the pantry could not help all these individuals in the community!

In November, the pantry received 3,500 pounds of food from the boy scouts "scouting for food" drive and the Hempfield High School food drive collected 2,712 pounds. Currently, Stauffers (Rohrerstown) is running a food drive for the pantry. Even with the large amount of food the pantry received in the past months, the following items are still requested: Applesauce, Cereal, Canned Peaches, Canned Pears, Canned Mixed Fruit, Canned Mandarin Oranges, Strawberry and/or Grape Jelly. Please note that the pantry prefers non-glass containers. Thank you!
