

FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

INTRODUCTION

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected on the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion—with high delight—"we proclaim the Lord's death."



Last Sunday we lit the Candle of Joy. We light it, the Candle of Peace, and the Candle of Hope again as we remember Jesus, born in Bethlehem, our hope, our peace, and our joy.

Today we light the Fourth Candle of Advent, the Candle of Love. An angel appeared to Zechariah in the temple to tell him that, in their old age, God would give Zechariah and Elizabeth a son called John. John spoke to the people bravely in the desert denying his own comforts and prepared to die for what he believed. John taught that we should share what we have with others, treat each other kindly and show God's love. He did this because he cared for people and wanted them to repent and find God's forgiveness.

Love is like a candle shining in a dark place. As we look at the light of this candle, we celebrate the love we have in Christ.

A: ¹⁸Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. Congregation: Please stand if you are able.


People of God, I ask you:





Postlude

BEING RECOGNIZED, ENCOUNTERING CHRIST

Often called the visitation, the encounter between Mary and Elizabeth is full of joy, recognition, gratitude, and blessing. Luke immediately follows the annunciation with Mary's journey to visit Elizabeth, who gives this unmarried pregnant girl not only a safe haven but also the first glimpse of what it means to be the mother of the Savior. The encounter is full of mystery and grace: the mystery of new life forming but still invisible, and the grace of recognizing each other as the Spirit-filled mothers they are becoming.

The story is also full of theological gravity: as the women encounter each other, so do Jesus and John the Baptist. Yet the theological meaning is almost overshadowed by the sheer physicality of the encounter. Imagine the hasty travel, demonstrative greeting, joyful exclamation, the unborn John leaping for joy, and robust singing. As the celebration of Christ's birth approaches, the four active and responsive bodies in this text remind us that this is, after all, the incarnation itself unfolding.

God becomes a body in Jesus, and that body will be offered up for the sake of the world. This body, recognized already by John in the womb, will eventually undergo the suffering and shame of death on a cross. Without losing sight of that big picture, today we enter into the up-close picture of Mary and Elizabeth's encounter and share in the joy and gratitude they have in common with all who recognize Christ in their neighbor.



IMAGES IN THE READINGS

The **pregnant woman** can be a symbol of the life that comes from God. In the Bible, many women, from Eve in Genesis 4:1 on, conceive and bear children with the help of God. Here both the virgin Mary and the post-menopausal Elizabeth are pregnant. When we acclaim God as creator, we attest that God is continually creating life on this earth.

What has been termed "the Visitation" is observed also on May 31. Recently many women have found inspiration in this story of **two women**, each in some way outside the mainstream, supporting one another.

The **arm of the LORD** is a repeated image in the Old Testament. Biblical imagery describes God's activities as if God had a human-like body, although with scarce reference to male or female generative organs. By the fifth century, theologians, quite aware of polytheisms in which the deities have bodies, opposed any literal belief in God as a superhuman. Singing Mary's Magnificat in Advent, we think of the infant's arms as the almighty power of God.

Bethlehem means house of bread. We come each week to the table, welcomed to Christ's house of bread.

During this pandemic time, we continue to serve clients with a pre-packed box of food items (staples, fresh produce, meat, eggs, cheese, and bread/pastry items) placed directly in their car trunk. Clients do not enter the building for their food items. Clients may visit the pantry once a week, either Monday or Wednesday; an average of 75-100 families currently visit the pantry each week. The pantry clients are very appreciative for the food assistance they receive to feed their families as they struggle to make ends meet!
