

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AT ZION

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning.

ONLINE: Indoor worship services are live-streamed on the church YouTube channel: <u>http://bit.ly/Zion_Live</u>. If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. When the service is held outdoors, there will be no live-stream.

FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

- Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. There are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the parlor as a <u>cry room</u> while also still being able to listen to the service.
- Ushers are located near the front and back of the worship area to direct people to seating, assist with other matters, and to answer questions.
- ✤ <u>Mask wearing</u> is optional for all who attend or participate in indoor gatherings, including worship, at the church.





ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING/CHILDREN'S CHAT

- R: Today is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We light the candles of Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love.
- Pastor and R: Say it with us: Christ has come, Christ is coming, and Christ will come again!

C: Christ has come, Christ is coming, and Christ will come again.

R: Mark 5:43 After Jesus raised the daughter of Jairus from the dead, "he strictly ordered them that no one should know this and told them to give her something to eat."

- R: Why weren't Christ's disciples, Jairus and his family allowed to tell others what had happened? The girl who was dead was alive again! What's going on here?
- P: Strange, isn't it? Jesus often tells us to keep his identity a secret, because he wants us to know <u>how he is the Messiah</u> before we tell others. People who know Jesus understand, "Anyone who wants to be first must be last and the servant of all." Notice: God chooses lowly Mary of Nazareth to birth the Son of God.
- R: We light the Advent candles on this wreath with joy, because we know both who the Messiah is and how he is the Messiah, by becoming last and the servant of all! Let us pray. Come, Lord Jesus. Come quickly! Show us how you became last by being born in a manger and being visited by lowly shepherds. We love you. Amen.
- **P & R:** We get to be last of all and servant of all together!
- All: We get to be last and first together!







NICENE CREED

- P: Let us profess our faith together.
- C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. You are pleased to make your home among us. Make our homecomings joyful as we gather with friends, families, and chosen families in celebration. Grant safety to all who travel. Sustain the work of Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services and other ministries that assist in setting up new homes. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

Blessed are you for Mary and all your servants in every generation who lived according to your promise of mercy. Strengthen us by their example until the revelation of your glory is made known. Merciful God, **receive our prayer.**

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER & WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: Abiding God, you made an everlasting covenant with your people, and when that covenant was jeopardized you sent your Son Jesus. In bread and wine, he reenacted your Passover promises, and became the Lamb of God that takes away our sin. Send now your Holy Spirit on us that we may hold fast to what is good and live in the freedom of being your children.

Send your Spirit upon this bread and cup that they may be for us the body and blood of your Son, Jesus Christ, who at supper with his disciples, took bread, and gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup. Again, he gave you thanks, and gave it to his disciples saying, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Great is the mystery of faith.

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: God of justice, send your Spirit upon your people in their wilderness. Bring good news to the oppressed and all who live with the chains of debt. Bind up the brokenhearted and any who languish in the slavery of another's scheming or the exile of their own folly. Proclaim liberty to the captives and those who live under

the shadow of fear at home, at work, or in their neighborhood. Announce release to the prisoners and to all who are incarcerated by their own body or the travails of their own mind. Usher in the year of your favor and deliver your people from sin and guilt and addiction and shame. Provide for all who mourn that they may have a garland of ashes, and the oil of gladness instead of mourning. Show us your face, everlasting God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When giving the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."


Please use this time for quiet reflection or join in singing the communion hymns until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seats.





FOOD PANTRY UPDATE

Thank you, Zion, for contributing food items and financial donations to the Pantry!

In October, the pantry served a total of 1,956 people (544 children, 950 adults, 462 seniors, and 18 new families). Without the 40 volunteers who served over 600 hours, the pantry could not help all these individuals in the community!

In November, the pantry received 3,500 pounds of food from the Boy Scouts Scouting for Food drive and the Hempfield High School food drive collected 2,712 pounds. Currently, Stauffers (Rohrerstown) is running a food drive for the pantry. *Even with the large amount of food the pantry received in the past months, the following items are still requested: Applesauce, Cereal, Canned Peaches, Canned Pears, Canned Mixed Fruit, Canned Mandarin Oranges, Strawberry and/or Grape Jelly.* Please note that the pantry prefers non-glass containers. Thank you!

ADVENT BANNERS

As we prepare for the coming birth of Jesus, the anticipation builds as a banner in front of the Sanctuary is added each week. The 4^{th} banner design has swirls ascending upward leading to a city with a heart in the middle and a star above. This banner illustrates the journey to Bethlehem. The 3^{rd} banner design is of an angel holding a heart above its head with swirls ascending, extending upward to God and the heavens. The 2^{nd} banner has a candle with a heart in its flame and a swirl rising upward symbolizing prayer and commitment to God. This banner represents our turning to God. The 1^{st} banner has a large, open hand of God with a heart in the middle of the hand and a swirl descending to us. The idea is that God chooses us in grace and stirs our hearts in love and power.
