FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

- ❖ Mask wearing is recommended for all who attend or participate in any indoor gathering, including worship, at the church. The Community Meal had a very successful year in 2021. Meals were served on 37 Thursday evenings, by 12 different churches and community groups, for a grand total of 3,947 meals. What a wonderful ministry to the community that Zion is leading!

The Community Meal is on a three-week hiatus over the holiday season. Meals will resume on January 13 and we will continue to use the drive-thru pick up until it is safe to return to a "sit down" meal. Open dates for meal sponsorship remain throughout the year, with the most immediate needs on January 20, February 17, and March 17. If these dates remain open, Zion will have to step in to provide these meals. Thanks to a generous anonymous donor, we have the funds to purchase the food needed, but volunteers will be also needed to get the meals prepared and out the door. So, stay tuned, and watch for email requests for volunteer help. If you have not volunteered in the past, now is the time to give this ministry a try -- and we have lots of fun!
