

ABOUT TODAY'S READINGS

All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just pastors and deacons but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called "the house of God, and . . . the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

NICENE CREED

"FOLLOW ME"

We live in a culture of invitation. Television invites us to join complicated story arcs so that we feel connected to the characters. Commercials invite us to see their product as a new movement and invite us to join it. We are invited to join groups on Facebook and invited into chat rooms and blog responses. The number of social networks is exploding as we are invited into ever expanding ways to connect.

Invitation is an essential part of our walk of faith, but here we frequently see ourselves not as the invited but rather the one who is supposed to be doing the inviting. We can misuse invitation, maybe using the phrase "invite Jesus into your heart," which often results in the misunderstanding that we are carrying a little bit of Jesus wherever we go. But today's gospel (John 1:43-51) emphasizes not invitation as our call to others to join the walk of faith but rather Jesus' invitation to us to follow him. Jesus' invitation is not that we carry him with us but rather that we follow where he would lead. When Christ invites Philip to "follow me," may we hear that invitation in our own ears.

IMAGES IN THE READINGS

God calls. The many **call** narratives in the Bible testify that this God is the kind of deity who knows us by name and who calls us into new life. Samuel, the Corinthian Christians, Philip, and Nathanael have all been called into a new identity. At baptism we are called both by our secular name and by our adopted name, Christian, that is, "of Christ."

That the **heaven opens** is a biblical phrase based on the ancient idea that the sky was a fixed dome that separated the earth from the upper sphere of God. The synoptic gospels refer to the heavens opening both at Jesus' baptism and at the end of time, when God will finally "descend" in majesty to bring an end of the cosmos as we know it. For us, this opening of the heaven can mean that in Christ, the separation between divine and human no longer exists.

The story of the **boy Samuel** has been beloved by Christians as a way to affirm the faith of also children.

For Paul, baptism makes us part of the **body** of Christ, the body that in Jesus died and rose, the body of the church that now contains the Spirit of Christ. This baptismal understanding of the body of the Christian stands in stark contrast to how our culture views the body as the possession of the sovereign individual who inhabits it. John's gospel calls Jesus the temple, and Paul refers to the body of Christian believers as the temple.


