## **FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON**

- ❖ Mask wearing is recommended for all who attend or participate in any indoor gathering, including worship, at the church. 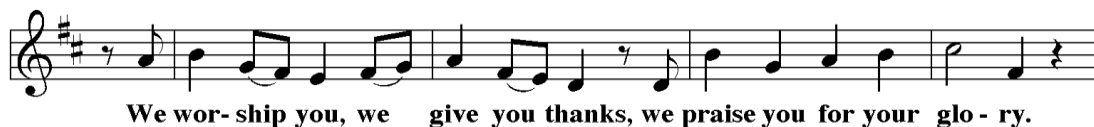

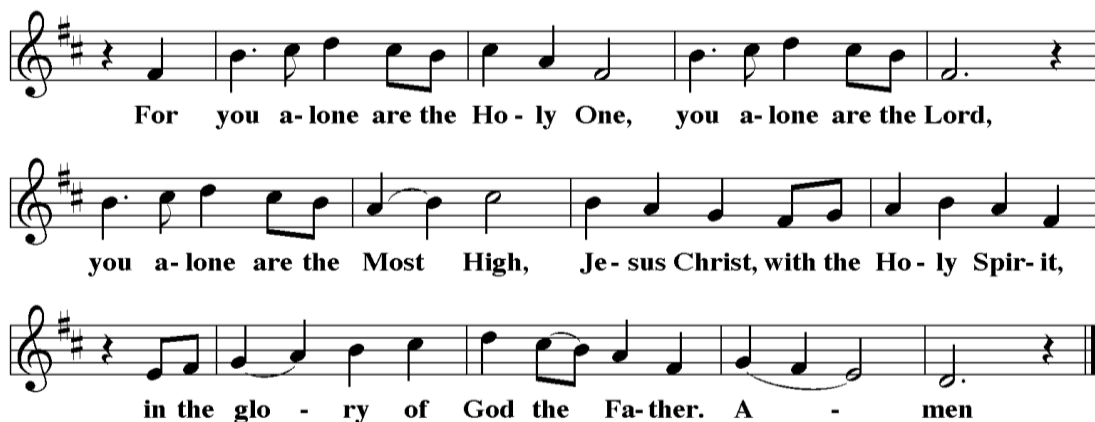

## NICENE CREED



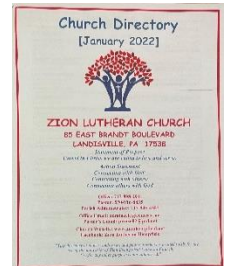

# Using Intuition in Your Work



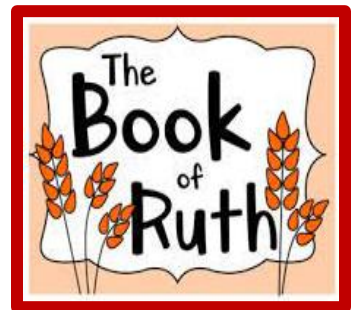

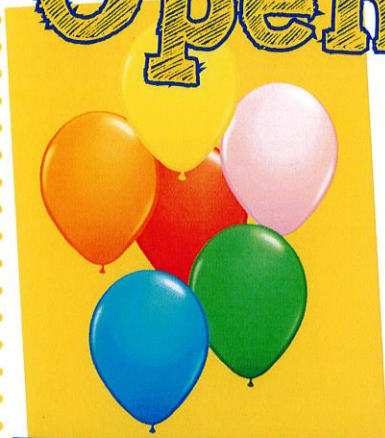
