ABOUT EPIPHANY SUNDAY

Epiphany means "manifestation" or "to make known." On this day we celebrate the revealing of Christ to all nations. Some Christian traditions celebrate three great epiphanies on this day: the magi's adoration of the Christ child, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River, and Christ's first miracle of changing water into wine. The word and sacraments are for us the great epiphany of God's grace and mercy. We go forth to witness to the light that shines brightly in our midst.

This day also marks the last day of the Christmas season. Unlike the words in *The Twelve Days of Christmas*, don't expect to see twelve drummers drumming today!

ABOUT THE GIFTS OF THE MAGI

The three gifts had a spiritual meaning: **gold** as a symbol of kingship on earth, **frankincense** (an incense) as a symbol of deity, and **myrrh** (an embalming oil) as a symbol of death. ... Sometimes this is described more generally as **gold symbolizing** virtue, **frankincense symbolizing** prayer, and **myrrh symbolizing** suffering.



GENERAL INFORMATION

WELCOME TO ZION! We are glad you have chosen to worship with us. The purpose of this bulletin is to guide you through our worship service. There is childcare available in the pre-school Sunday School room for children ages 5 and under if you chose not to keep your child in the worship service. Alternatively, the Parlor may also be used as a "cry room" where the worship service can still be heard. Parents or two people certified by Zion's Safe Church Policy must always remain with a child. Any child (2-12 years old) who leaves the worship area during the service, must be accompanied by a parent.

During the Faith Formation hour, middle and high school youth are invited to the ZYM room for a time of catching up and topical conversation.






This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles— for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. GOSPEL READING

Matthew 2:1-12

Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage."

When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they

offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.
