

¹¹Remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called "the uncircumcision" by **A**: those who are called "the circumcision"—a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands—¹²remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. ¹³But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. ¹⁴For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us. ¹⁵He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, ¹⁶ and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. ¹⁷So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near; ¹⁸ for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹ So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, ²⁰built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone. ²¹In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord; ²²in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.



AT REST AMONG STRANGERS

The world can be a dangerous place, and we all long for someone, some leader, who will watch over us and protect us from all harm. The prophet Jeremiah issues strong cautions to those who abuse the trust placed in them to care for God's people, and the psalmist sings the praises of the Lord who guards and guides us through life's trials.

But the letter to the Ephesians suggests that lasting safety comes through the healing and reconciling work of Christ, which allows us to share a meal with those we are inclined to regard as enemies, because Christ has "broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us." So, in Christ, aliens become citizens and strangers become members of the household of God.

Living into this reality requires all of us to be diligent in our practices with and policies toward all kinds of "strangers and aliens" in our world and in our lives. It means making peace with those whose politics make them strange to us, and creating genuine welcome for the newcomer in our classrooms, workplaces and congregations. It means considering the needs of immigrants and refugees through the lens of Christian faith as well as national identity, and not assuming the two are the same.

The reassuring news this day is that God, unlike so many who hold power in this world, is already reconciling the world to God's own self and us to one another. We enact this new reality each time we pass the peace or come to the Lord's supper, not because we have finally achieved the peace we seek, but because in Christ God's future reign of peace has already broken into our present.



IMAGES IN THE READINGS

Many sets of lectionary readings include the image of Christ as our **shepherd**. The task is twofold: to avoid a sentimental interpretation of an image that is distant from the experience of most worshipers, and to respect the metaphor of sheep, which the Bible uses to suggest the goodness of the caring Creator.

Jesus wore **fringes** on his cloak. Numbers 15:37-41 interprets the fringes worn by observant Jewish males as reminders that God's commandments are more important than one's own desires. A parallel for Christians might be the wearing of a cross or crucifix. Mark's gospel suggests that the holiness symbolized by Jesus' fringes was so powerful that it could be transferred to the sick to make them whole.

The imagery of the **Branch** of David has been popularized throughout Christian history in artistic depictions of the tree of Jesse.

In the famous poem "Mending Wall" by Robert Frost is the line, "Good fences make good neighbors." Ephesians says just the opposite: in Christ the walls have been broken down. We live together as one building.

ZION NIGHT AT THE BARNSTORMERS: Aug. 18


