



† THE WORD †

ACTS 16:16-34

While in prison, Paul speaks to the jailer, who is then baptized.

A: ¹⁶ One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷ While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." ¹⁸ She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

¹⁹ But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰ When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews ²¹ and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." ²² The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. ²³ After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴ Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵ About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶ Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷ When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸ But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹ The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰ Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹ They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³² They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³ At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. ³⁴ He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star." ¹⁷ The Spirit and the bride say, "Come." And let everyone who hears say, "Come." And let everyone who is thirsty come. Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as a gift. [¹⁸I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: if anyone adds to them, God will add to that person the plagues described in this book;" ¹⁹ if anyone takes away from the words of the book of this prophecy, God will take away that person's share in the tree of life and in the holy city, which are described in this book." ²⁰ The one who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." MESSAGE

Pastor Tim Seitz-Brown

The Revised Common Lectionary leaves out verses 15 and 18–19 from Revelation 22—not to hide the truth, but to let the light of grace shine undimmed.

The missing verses carry sharp warnings, and too often they distract the hearer from the loving, open-armed invitation of Christ.

The Church, in her wisdom, sets the table for grace, so that all may hear the Spirit and the Bride say, "Come."

But even the hard words have a healing song in them, if we have ears to hear.

These are not words of final rejection, but of deep concern—warning us not to twist the gospel, not to trade the song of the Lamb for the noise of fear.

Those called "outside" are not barred by God.

No, they are still moving to the old rhythm of the world—grasping, afraid, locked in self-preservation.



But the Lamb—ah, the Lamb!—He plays another melody.

A song of mercy, of peace, of love poured out.

And that song is still playing.

That door is still open.

That invitation still rings:

Come and hear it. Come and live it.

P: The Lord be with you.

P: Glorious God, you reign above all the earth, robed in righteousness and girded with justice. The mountains melt like wax before you, and your light flashes out for the world to see. Your faithful ones rejoice in your name, for you are the Most High over all the earth.

You saw your people bound and trembling—Paul and Silas singing hymns in the dark of the prison, the jailer stunned by grace. You opened every door, shook the very foundations, and called your beloved into freedom and faith. In Christ Jesus you made a new family at the midnight hour, baptizing captives and captors alike into joy.

You have not left us orphaned. In your Son, Jesus Christ, you have drawn us into your very heart. He prays for us still—that we may be one, just as you are one. By his Spirit, we are joined in love, that the world might believe.

Therefore with all the baptized, with angels and archangels, and with those set free from every chain, we sing the unending hymn of praise:

God of the Lamb, you prepare a feast in the presence of those who hunger. You invite all who thirst to come to the water of life without price. As your Son broke bread with friends and strangers, open our hearts to receive him now in the simple gifts of bread and wine.

Send your Holy Spirit upon this meal and make it holy. Sanctify this bread and cup, that they may be for us the body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Who, on the night in which he was betrayed, took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this in remembrance of me." Great is the mystery of faith.

P: God of unity and joy, bless your church with the love that bound Christ to you from the foundation of the world. Make us one as you are one, so that the world may believe. Pour out your healing on those who suffer in body, mind, or spirit. Turn hearts from fear to faith, from isolation to communion, from grief to dancing. Fill the earth with your righteousness, and let all creation rejoice.

As the Spirit and the bride say, "Come," may we echo the invitation to all. Come, Lord Jesus, and bring us to that bright city where the gates are never shut, where the tree of life yields healing for the nations, and where your servants worship you in endless light.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God now and forever.

Throughout the month, 563 children, 979 adults, and 432 seniors were served, including 11 new families that were registered to start receiving food. How remarkable it is to know that the Pantry has impacted 1,974 people from the community in only one month. Additionally, 51 volunteers worked 637 hours over the course of the month – what a gift!


