

#### ATHANASIAN CREED

Lutherans accept the three historic creeds of the church – Apostles, Nicean, and Athanasian. These creeds are all products of the early church. The Athanasian Creed is traditionally for the Festival of the Holy Trinity. Since the Athanasian Creed is very long we are using only a small portion of it this morning.

P: We now proclaim our faith with words from the Athanasian Creed:

**C:** Almighty is the Father;

Almighty is the Son;

Almighty is the Spirit;

And yet there are not three almighty beings, but one who is almighty.

Thus the Father is God;

The Son is God:

The Holy Spirit is God;

Thus the Father is Lord:

The Holy Spirit is Lord.

hear our prayer.

Holy God, we remember your saints for their strong faith and witness, even unto death. Console grieving families. Stir up in us the resolve to end the sin of white supremacy and pursue the courageous path of justice. God of grace,

hear our prayer.

- P: Reveal yourself to us in the breaking of the bread. Raise us up as the body of Christ in the world. Breathe new life into us. Send us forth, burning with justice, peace and love.
- C: Come, Lord Jesus.
- P: With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and Holy Trinity, now and forever.

When you have everything needed for one kit, place the bag in the collection chest which is across from the mailboxes in the Narthex.

### Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit: One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended Two or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging\* One sturdy comb. There are many different types of hair texture, so no picks or fine-toothed combs; remove packaging One metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging \*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.

#### UPCOMING EVENT THROUGH THE PARISH RESOURCE CENTER



Lancaster City is home to several iconic cemeteries, each of them with a unique story to tell. Many well-known people are buried within the confines of these cemeteries, shaded by beautiful trees and resting alongside intricate gravestones. Join our knowledgeable tour guide as we explore Lancaster City's historic cemeteries, and learn about the lives of the remarkable people interred within them.

The tour will explore four major cemeteries:

- Lancaster Cemetery
- Shreiner-Concord Cemetery
- Greenwood and Woodward Hill Cemetery
- St. James Episcopal Cemetery

At each of the cemeteries, we will focus on the people buried there that helped to shape the history of Lancaster. We will explore the stories and background of these notable individuals, and by focusing on the cemeteries in which they are buried, you will gain a unique perspective on their lives and impact on the culture around us.

We will meet at the Parish Resource Center at 8:15 am to load the bus and leave by 8:30 am. Please wear comfortable shoes and appropriate clothing for the weather. The bus will drop us off as near to each cemetery's entryway as possible. We will be standing and walking for much of the time touring cemeteries. We will return to PRC by 12:30 p.m. The rain date is June 20
