

INTRODUCTION

In Luke, Jesus crosses boundaries to restore a man lost among the tombs. We, too, know what it is to be bound by sorrow or divided by fear. But in Christ, we are clothed, restored, and made one. Today, in scripture, song, and sacrament, we come to sit at Jesus' feet. Here, distinctions fall away. Here, we are welcomed. Here, we praise the God who heals and makes us whole. Here, we are formed to walk together in the way of Jesus.

ISAIAH 65:1-9

The prophet sent to a rebellious people.

¹ I was ready to be sought out by those who did not ask, to be found by those who A: did not seek me. I said, "Here I am, here I am," to a nation that did not call on my name. ² I held out my hands all day long to a rebellious people, who walk in a way that is not good, following their own devices; ³ a people who provoke me to my face continually, sacrificing in gardens and offering incense on bricks; 4 who sit inside tombs, and spend the night in secret places; who eat swine's flesh, with broth of abominable things in their vessels; 5 who say, "Keep to yourself, do not come near me, for I am too holy for you." These are a smoke in my nostrils, a fire that burns all day long. ⁶ See, it is written before me: I will not keep silent, but I will repay; I will indeed repay into their laps ⁷ their iniquities and their ancestors' iniquities together, says the LORD; because they offered incense on the mountains and reviled me on the hills, I will measure into their laps full payment for their actions. 8 Thus says the LORD: As the wine is found in the cluster, and they say, "Do not destroy it, for there is a blessing in it," so I will do for my servants' sake, and not destroy them all. ⁹ I will bring forth descendants from Jacob, and from Judah inheritors of my mountains; my chosen shall inherit it, and my servants shall settle there.





LUKE 8:26-39

Jesus casts out demons possessing a man of the Gerasenes.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 8th chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

P: ²⁶ Then [Jesus and his disciples] arrived at the country of the Gerasenes, which is opposite Galilee. ²⁷ As he stepped out on land, a man of the city who had demons met him. For a long time he had worn no clothes, and he did not live in a house but in the tombs. ²⁸ When he saw Jesus, he fell down before him and shouted at the top of his voice, "What have you to do with me, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg you, do not torment me"—²⁹ for Jesus had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. (For many times it had seized him; he was kept under guard and bound with chains and shackles, but he would break the bonds and be driven by the demon into the wilds.) ³⁰ Jesus then asked him, "What is your name?" He said, "Legion"; for many demons had entered him. ³¹ They begged him not to order them to go back into the abyss.

³² Now there on the hillside a large herd of swine was feeding; and the demons begged Jesus to let them enter these. So he gave them permission. ³³ Then the demons came out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd rushed down the steep bank into the lake and was drowned.

³⁴ When the swineherds saw what had happened, they ran off and told it in the city and in the country. ³⁵ Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. ³⁶ Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had

been healed. ³⁷ Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. ³⁸ The man from whom the demons had gone begged that he might be with him; but Jesus sent him away, saying, ³⁹ "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." So he went away, proclaiming throughout the city how much Jesus had done for him.

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

Please use this time for quiet reflection or sing the communion songs until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seats.



Repeat the refrain only the first time. Sing thru it only once after each verse.



SOMEONE IN THE WORLD IS FORCED TO FLEE THEIR HOME DUE TO PERSECUTION, CONFLICT, AND VIOLENCE.





Each year, World Refugee Day is recognized globally on June 20 to shine a light on the rights, needs, and dreams of people who have been forced to flee their homes.

OVER 139 MILLION PEOPLE ARE EXPECTED TO BE FORCIBLY DISPLACED OR STATELESS BY THE END OF THIS YEAR.

Right now millions of lives are being torn apart by conflict, persecution, insecurity or human rights violations. Less than 1% of those who have been forced to flee will find safety in resettlement to a third country like the United States, often after years of displacement. Instead, migrants, refugees, and people seeking asylum often face continued challenges and persecution as they work to keep their families safe and rebuild their lives.

For centuries, Lancaster County has been a place of refuge for individuals and families fleeing persecution and violence. CWS Lancaster is proud to stand in that long tradition, providing hope and home to more than 7,000 new refugee and immigrant neighbors since opening our office in 1987.

Across the nation and right here in Lancaster, refugees and immigrants are facing fear and uncertainty. Refugee resettlement has been halted, asylum seekers can no longer access their legal right to pursue safety, and immigrant families are being forced apart. These are not just statistics—these are real people, real families, real lives.

As we are reminded by Jesus in Matthew 25:35, "For I was a stranger and you welcomed me." In this spirit, we pray:



Wise and compassionate God, help us to be willing to respond to the needs of refugees and asylum-seekers, not to see them as burdens, and shift our care unto others.

Help our leaders act with generosity and compassion.

We pray for people living in fear of displacement and for those who are displaced currently, facing an uncertain future.

We ask that they know your love, and presence, and are filled with your peace.

Open our eyes, that we may see injustice; open our ears that we may hear a stranger's cry.

Open our mouths that we may speak words of welcome.

Bless the work of our hands so that together we may act.
