**IN-PERSON:** All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning. During the summer months (June-September), the service will be held outdoors on the first Sunday of each month.















Gehenna refers to the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, located south of Jerusalem:

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

Please use this time for quiet reflection or join in singing the communion songs until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seats.




