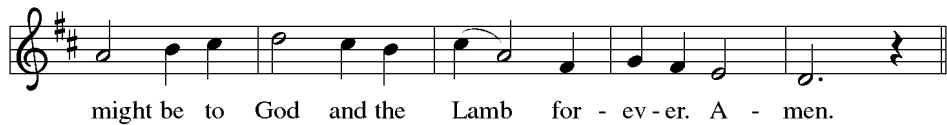

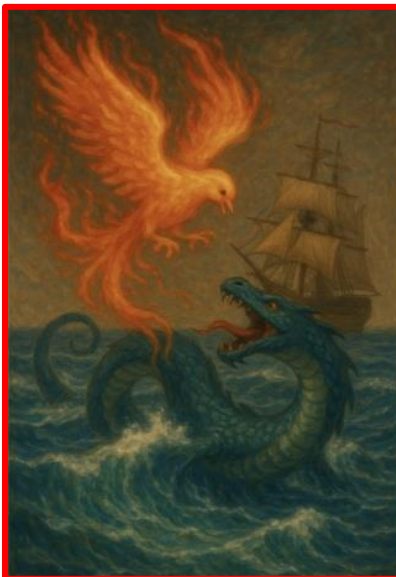

NICENE CREED

P: Let us profess our faith together.

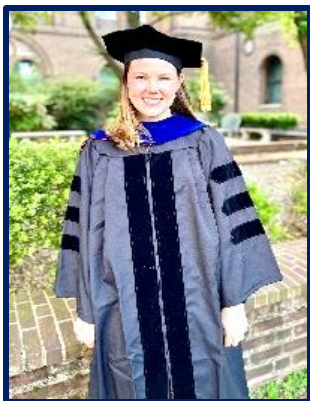


Ty Myers: Ty graduated from Hempfield High School and will be attending Millersville University in the fall. He plans to major in accounting and finance and to minor in economics.

PENTECOST BANNER



This Pentecost banner shows the Holy Spirit as a dove surrounded by fire. The dove stands for the kind of peace God gives—deep, lasting, and life-giving. It's not the peace of avoiding trouble, but the peace that brings healing and wholeness.

The fire doesn't burn things up; instead, it burns with the passion of Christlike love—love that is willing to give, serve, and transform.

The flames remind us of the Spirit resting on the disciples at Pentecost, sending them into the world with courage and compassion.

The red background stands for the fire and power of the Holy Spirit. But it also points to something more: the Spirit's power to renew the face of the earth, as it says in Psalm 104:30.

Pentecost isn't just about the Church's birth—it's about all creation being made new.

The Spirit gives us a longing for healing, justice, and peace—for a world made whole.

This banner reminds us that we are filled with that same Spirit, sent to live in love and work for the good of all.

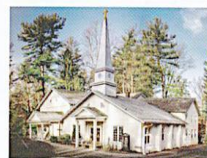
