INTRODUCTION








Men's Retreat at Kirchenwald April 29-30, 2022



"And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, "This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!"

TODAY, the Sunday Scholars (adult parlor class) will begin the hit television series, the Chosen. This will be shown in the sanctuary after Sunday service. The Chosen is the widely-acclaimed crowd-funded project depicting the ministry of Jesus Christ as witnessed by his followers. Jesus' words of salvation are taken verbatim from the gospels, but the plot of each episode includes the director's imagination of how the events in the

gospel tie together.
