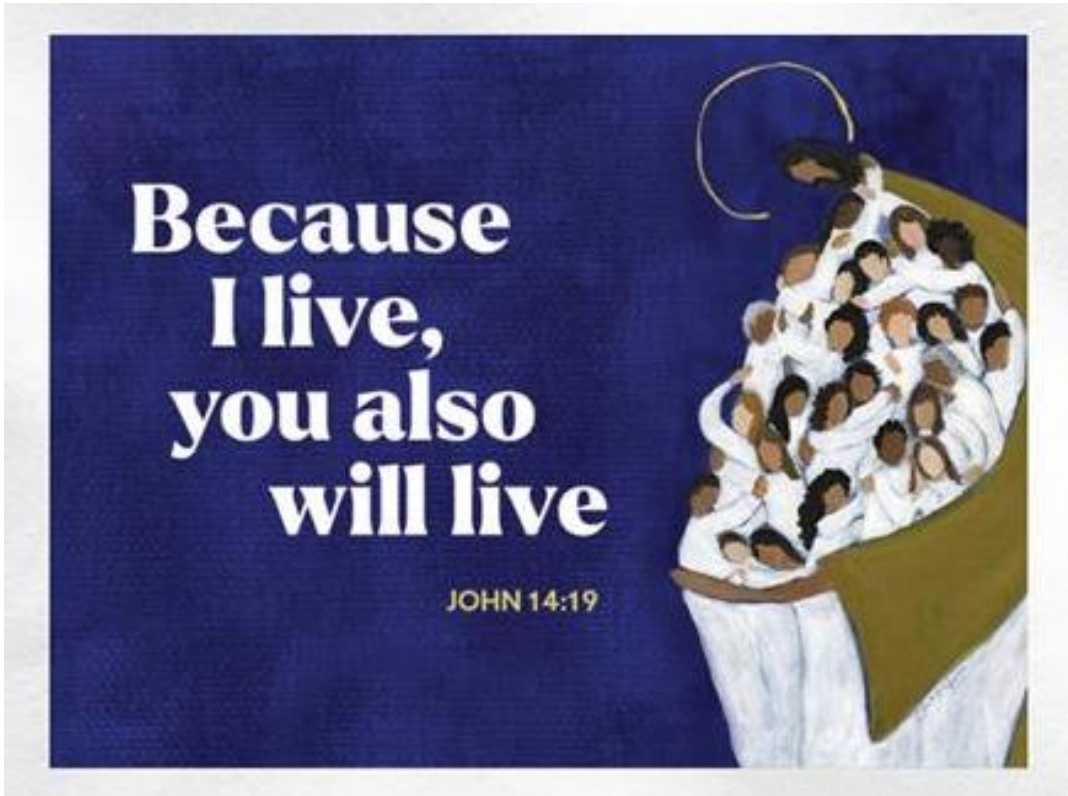

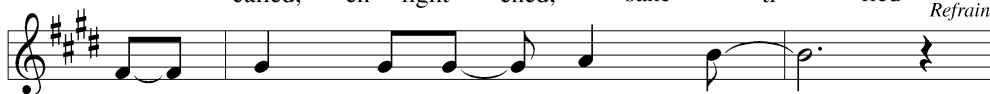

You guide us to springs of the water of life.

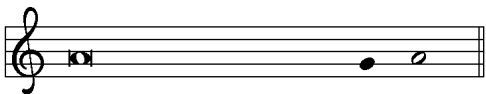

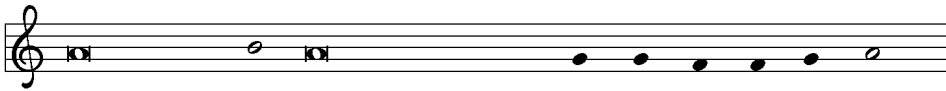

ACTS 17:22-31

Paul's message to the Athenians.

A: ²² Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely spiritual you are in every way. ²³ For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴ The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵ nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶ From one ancestor he made all peoples to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷ so that they would search for God and perhaps fumble about for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸ For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said, ‘For we, too, are his offspring.’ ²⁹ “Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold or silver or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. ³⁰ While God has

overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹ because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

The days of Noah, a sign of baptism.

A: ¹³ Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴ But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵ but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you, ¹⁶ yet do it with gentleness and respect. Maintain a good conscience so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷ For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸ For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹ in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰ who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight lives, were saved through water. ²¹ And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²² who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

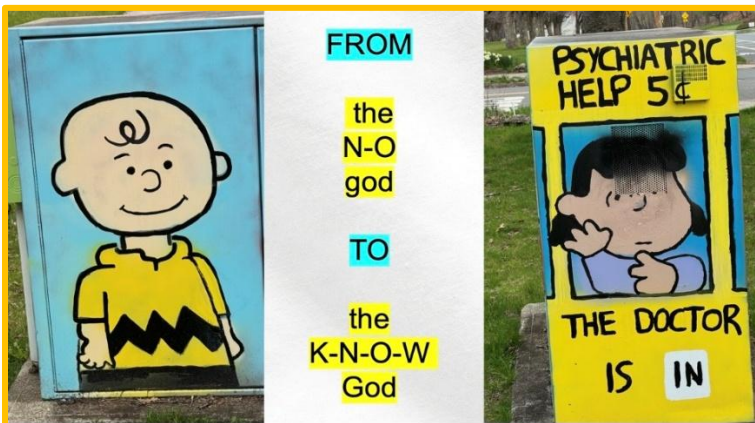

NICENE CREED

P: Let us profess our faith together.

C: **We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.**

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

A: Trusting in the power of Christ's resurrection to heal and redeem our broken world, let us pray for the needs of all creation.

A brief silence.

God of new life, you call us through the waters of baptism into right and life-giving relationships with you and one another. Guide the church and its leaders to proclaim Christ, who makes relationships right, healthy, and whole throughout the world. Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

You create the world and all that is in it. Shelter the fields and forests of Lancaster County, nurture young animals and budding plants, protect clean streams and unpolluted water, and raise up faithful stewards of the land. Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

You set civil servants in the places where we live. Shape them to reflect the Creator's desire for interconnected wellbeing, rooting truth and equity among judges and lawyers, gentleness and courage among first responders, and peace among leaders of towns and nations, especially in the United States, so that all communities may flourish together. Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

You provide comfort in times of trouble. Heal those who are sick, shelter any who are unhoused, feed those undernourished, and accompany and console all who are lonely, bereaved, anxious, or ill especially those on Zion's prayer list and those for whom we pray either silently or aloud (*allow time for people to lift up their prayers*) Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

You are love and you desire that we love one another. As a mother hen cares for her chicks, bless all who provide motherly care in our lives, and inspire us to care for one another. Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.

P: God of new life, your steadfast love endures forever. Inspire us by the example of the faithful departed, who clung to your promises of life, forgiveness of sins, and salvation. Merciful God,
receive our prayer.

God of resurrection power, use us and these prayers to proclaim the good news of new life to all the world, through Jesus Christ, our risen Savior.

Nourish us with the body and blood of Jesus, that goodness and mercy may follow us and bless the world you love. In the name of Jesus,

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: Holy God, mighty and merciful, heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Blessed are you, O God, among the peoples; let the sound of praise be heard. In you we live and move and have our being. You are not far from any one of us.

We did not know you. We named you unknown. Yet you have made yourself known to us.

In great love you sent Jesus, your Son. He came among us: healing, speaking, gathering, turning us toward you. On the cross he opened his arms to all, to bring us to you.

You raised him from the dead. You did not leave us alone. You gave the Advocate, the Spirit of truth, to abide with us, to teach us love, to make us one.

So we come to this table—not alone, not searching in the dark, but called, gathered, enlightened, and sanctified.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: *Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.*

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: *This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.*

Remembering his death, proclaiming his resurrection, awaiting his coming in glory, we stand within your promise: you will judge with justice, you will make all things new.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and cup. Abide with us here. Bind us together— one body, one people, one hope among the peoples.

Keep us in your love, that we may love not in word only, but in deed. Give us gentle and reverent voices to speak the hope that is in us.

Through this meal make us your witness— a living praise among the peoples, for you are not far, and in Christ you have drawn near.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, now and forever.

Amen.

P: Walk us out of darkness and make us your holy people as we pray the words you boldly taught us:

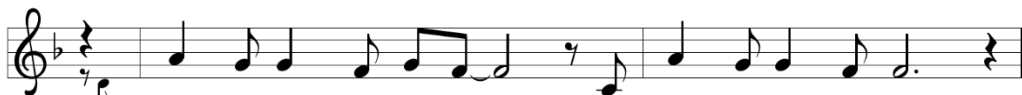
