INTRODUCTION

Widows are visible everywhere in today's readings. Jesus denounces those scribes who pray impressive prayers but devour widows' houses. He commends the poor widow who in his view gave far more than the major donors. Jesus doesn't see her simply as an object of compassion or charity. She, like the widow of Zarephath who shares her last bit of food with Elijah, does something of great importance.

When he came to the gate of the town, a widow was there gathering sticks; he called to her and said, "Bring me a little water in a vessel, so that I may drink." ¹¹As she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand." ¹²But she said, "As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a jug; I am now gathering a couple of sticks, so that I may go home and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it, and die." ¹³Elijah said to her, "Do not be afraid; go and do as you have said; but first make me a little cake of it and bring it to me, and afterwards make something for yourself and your son. ¹⁴For thus says the LORD the God of Israel: The jar of meal will not be emptied and the jug of oil will not fail until the day that the LORD sends rain on

the earth." ¹⁵She went and did as Elijah said, so that she as well as he and her household ate for many days. ¹⁶The jar of meal was not emptied, neither did the jug of oil fail, according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah.


The once for all sacrifice of Christ.

A: ²⁴Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. ²⁵Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; ²⁶for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is,

he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. ²⁷And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgment, ²⁸so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

MARK 12:38-44

A widow's generosity reveals the hypocrisy of the scribes.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 12th chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

P: ³⁸ As [Jesus] taught, he said, "Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces, ³⁹ and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honor at banquets! ⁴⁰ They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation."

⁴¹ He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. ⁴² A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. ⁴³ Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. ⁴⁴ For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

The Hebrew Scriptures' "Trinity of Vulnerability"

 the widow, the orphan, and the resident alien— represents society's most vulnerable individuals, who lacked family support, social standing, and legal protections.

Therefore, the Covenant Community was called to act with justice, compassion, and care for those at the margins.



Widow= The word "widow" appears 55 times in the Hebrew scriptures, often paired with other vulnerable groups.

Orphan/Fatherless= References to "orphan" or "fatherless" (Hebrew: yatom) appears 42 times.

Resident Alien/Foreigner= The term for "resident alien" or "foreigner" (Hebrew: ger) appears more than 90 times, though not all in conjunction with widow and orphan.

"Widow, orphan, and resident alien" = This phrase, grouping together the three groups occurs about a dozen times.



Deuteronomy 10:18= God is described as upholding the cause of the widow and orphan and loving the resident alien.

Jeremiah 7:6= Here mistreatment of widows and orphans and resident aliens is condemned.

Zechariah 7:10= This is a divine warning against oppressing these groups: the widow, the orphan, and the resident alien.

Consistent theme: Treat the marginalized well or everyone in your nation will suffer.

NICENE CREED

- P: Generations bless your faithfulness. You are the God who provides water in the wilderness, who leads the exiled home, who lifts up the lowly. Your love reaches across every divide, renewing hope in every heart that cries for justice.
- C: We bless you, O God.
- P: We give you thanks for your dear Son at the heart of human life, who loved the poor and the oppressed, who welcomed those cast aside, who himself became a stranger in need so that we might find our home in you.
- C: We thank you, O God.
- P: In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."
 - Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me."
- P: Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:
- C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
