

† THE WORD †

ISAIAH 65:17-25

The readings at the end of the year focus on death and last things, when God's reign of justice will be fully ushered in. The prophet promises that God's miraculous rescue of the exiles from Babylon pales in comparison to what the future God has in store.

¹⁷ For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth the former things shall A: not be remembered or come to mind. ¹⁸ But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating, for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy and its people as a delight. ¹⁹ I will rejoice in Jerusalem and delight in my people; no more shall the sound of weeping be heard in it or the cry of distress. ²⁰ No more shall there be in it an infant who lives but a few days or an old person who does not live out a lifetime, for one who dies at a hundred years will be considered a youth, and one who falls short of a hundred will be considered accursed. ²¹ They shall build houses and inhabit them; they shall plant vineyards and eat their fruit. ²² They shall not build and another inhabit; they shall not plant and another eat, for like the days of a tree shall the days of my people be, and my chosen shall long enjoy the work of their hands. ²³ They shall not labor in vain or bear children for calamity, for they shall be offspring blessed by the Lord—and their descendants as well. ²⁴Before they call I will answer, while they are yet speaking I will hear. ²⁵ The wolf and the lamb shall feed together; the lion shall eat straw like the ox, but the serpent—its food shall be dust! They shall not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain, says the Lord.

This psalm, paraphrased by Isaac Watts as "Joy to the World," is the exultant song of those who welcome God's reign of justice — not merely punishment — but the glad right ordering of creation.

 - ⁵ Sing to the Lord with the harp, with the harp and the voice of song.

 - ⁷ Let the sea roar, and all that fills it, the world and those who dwell therein.
 - ⁸ Let the rivers clap their hands, and let the hills ring out with joy before the Lord, who comes to judge the earth.
 - ⁹ The Lord will judge the world with righteousness and the peoples with equity.

2 THESSALONIANS 3:6-13

This reading is in part an answer to the question: If we expect Christ's return at any moment, how do we spend the meantime? The answer: keep working faithfully, in love—not in anxious speculation.

A: ⁶ Now we command you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from every brother or sister living irresponsibly and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not irresponsible when we were with you, ⁸ and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it, but with toil and labor we worked night and day so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹ This was not because we do not have that right but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹ For we hear that some of you are living

irresponsibly, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹² Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

LUKE 21:5-19

Jesus' teachings in the days before his betrayal, crucifixion, and resurrection were about the last things. Here he teaches in the presence of the Temple, a magnificent structure only recently completed by Herod the Great. While monumental and apparently permanent, it will be destroyed only 40 years later, when the Romans crush a rebellion.

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 21st chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

P: ⁵When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, [Jesus] said, ⁶ "As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down."

⁷They asked him, "Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?" ⁸And he said, "Beware that you are not led astray, for many will come in my name and say, 'I am he!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them.

⁹ "When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified, for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." ¹⁰ Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation and kingdom against kingdom; ¹¹ there will be great earthquakes and in various places famines and plagues, and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

¹² "But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³ This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance, ¹⁵ for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betrayed even by parents and siblings, by relatives and friends, and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your souls."



NICENE CREED

- P: Let us profess our faith together.
- C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. God of new songs, in our community of believers, fill us with energy for acts of compassion and bring us joy through worship and prayer. Inspire your people to create just and caring communities where everyone is valued. Hear us, O God.

God of every generation, we remember the saints with steadfast love and faithfulness – Elizabeth of Hungary, who gave her life for the poor and renewed society by her generosity; Clement of Rome, who strengthened the early church through conflict; Miguel Agustín Pro, who held fast to Christ and died with courage; Justus Falckner, Jehu Jones, and William Passavant — pastors in this land, who proclaimed Christ's mercy in word and deed. Hear us, O God.

We remember also all who have gone before us — especially those who, here at Zion and in our own lives, called us to follow the way of Christ. Confident in Christ's victory over death, may we be inspired by their example. Hear us, O God. **Your mercy is great.**

PRAYER

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: Blessed are you, Holy God, whose goodness is wider, deeper, and higher than we can ask or imagine. In the beginning, you made all things good. You delighted in your creation.

You called Israel out of bondage, led them through the waters, fed them in the wilderness, and taught them the way of justice – restoring right-relationship, where the vulnerable flourish, the stranger is welcomed, and the land itself rejoices.

Your prophets announced the coming Day when the arrogance of the proud is burned away, and the Sun of righteousness rises with healing.

And then – in the fullness of time – you sent Jesus. In him we see your jubilee heart: the hungry fed, the lost found, the sinners welcomed at the feast.

He taught us not to trust the grandeur of tyrants, nor fear the collapse of empires, but to live faithfully in the meantime – doing the next small act of love, trusting the future to you.

On the night before he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to the disciples saying: Take and eat; this is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

Again after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this in remembrance of me.

We hold this mystery:

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your Holy Spirit upon this bread and wine, and upon us.

Make us people who rejoice at your coming reign, as if justice is already breaking forth, as if mercy is already being born before our eyes.

Make us a people who bless the nations, repair what is torn, and labor with compassion – until all creation is healed.

Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

P: We pray together.

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

P: There is a place for you at the table of God. Come, receive the food that does not perish, a taste of life eternal.

PARTAKING IN THE BREAD AND CUP OF SALVATION

All baptized Christians are welcome to partake of the Holy Sacrament. Those who do not or choose not to partake of the sacrament may receive a blessing.

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

Please use this time for quiet reflection or song until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seats.


