

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning.

If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. When the service is held outdoors, there will be no live-stream.

SUNDAY MORNING INFORMATION

- Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. Children are invited to come forward for the Children's Chat. The Puppet Theater will share a special message on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month. In addition, there are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the parlor as a <u>cry room</u> while also still being able to listen to the service.


INTRODUCTION


Of all three years of the lectionary cycle, this year's All Saints readings have the most tears. Isaiah and Revelation look forward to the day when God will wipe away all tears; in John's gospel, Jesus weeps along with Mary and all the gathered mourners before he demonstrates his power over death. On All Saints Day we celebrate the victory won for all the faithful dead, but we grieve for our beloved dead as well, knowing that God honors our tears. We bring our grief to the table and find there a foretaste of Isaiah's feast to come.



The raising of Lazarus.

- P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the 11th chapter.

- P: ³²When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." ³³When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. ³⁴He said, "Where have you laid him?" 

I thought, if sin had not existed, we would all have been pure and as like to our Lord as when he made us.


So, in my folly, before this time, I wondered why, by the great foreseeing wisdom of God, the beginning of sin was not prevented.

For then, I thought, all should be well.


This troublesome worry ought greatly to be forsaken.

NICENE CREED

The Great Thanksgiving
