- ❖ Communion is distributed in continuous fashion or you may take one of the communion kits at the back of the Sanctuary if you prefer to commune at your seat.

P: In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

- C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: We pray for the gift of your Spirit: in our gathering; within this meal; among your people; throughout the world. Blessing, praise, and thanks to you, holy God, through Christ Jesus, by your Spirit, in your church, without end.

Please place communion cups & wrappers in the trash can as you exit the Sanctuary.

FOR THOSE COMMUNING BY COMING FORWARD

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

AFTER COMMUNING

Please use this time for quiet reflection until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seat. Fill out the communion card to keep your record up to date. Please stand if you are able.

POST-COMMUNION BLESSING

P: The body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, strengthen you and keep you in his grace.

C: Amen.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

- A: We give you thanks, most gracious God, that you have fed us with the bread of heaven and given us a foretaste of Paradise. Enliven us to be your body in the world and to serve those who are in need; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

BRICK REPOINTING UPDATE



Krimmel Masonry has completed brick repointing on the old bell tower this week! Work on this total project is now about 2/3 complete. The social hall walls facing the courtyard and the interior walkway will be done next. Deteriorated bricks over the basement windows facing Cooper Ave. have been removed and will be replaced. Scott Krimmel says that the bell tower mortar joints were seriously deteriorated and the work being done was needed for both structural reasons as well as cosmetic.

This is a huge project that needed to be done ... thanks to the Property Team, and particularly Steve Haun, who has made sure that the issues were addressed and dealt with before further damage developed.

COVENANT FOR RENEWAL MONTHLY MESSAGE FROM ADELE

- ❖ The <u>Executive Team</u>, is beginning work to update church policies. Starting with the funeral policy, they are making appropriate updates and revisions.
