- Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. There are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the parlor as a <u>cry room</u> while also still being able to listen to the service.



How does Jesus evaluate nations?

It's based upon how well each nation cares for these groups of vulnerable, marginalized people:

- The Poor: I was hungry, you gave me food; I was thirsty, you gave me drink; I was naked, you gave me clothing.
- The Sick: I was sick, and you took care of me.
- The Immigrant: I was a stranger (one of the "others") and you welcomed me.
- The Prisoner: I was in prison, and you visited me.




A "steward" is "someone who cares for what belongs to another".
