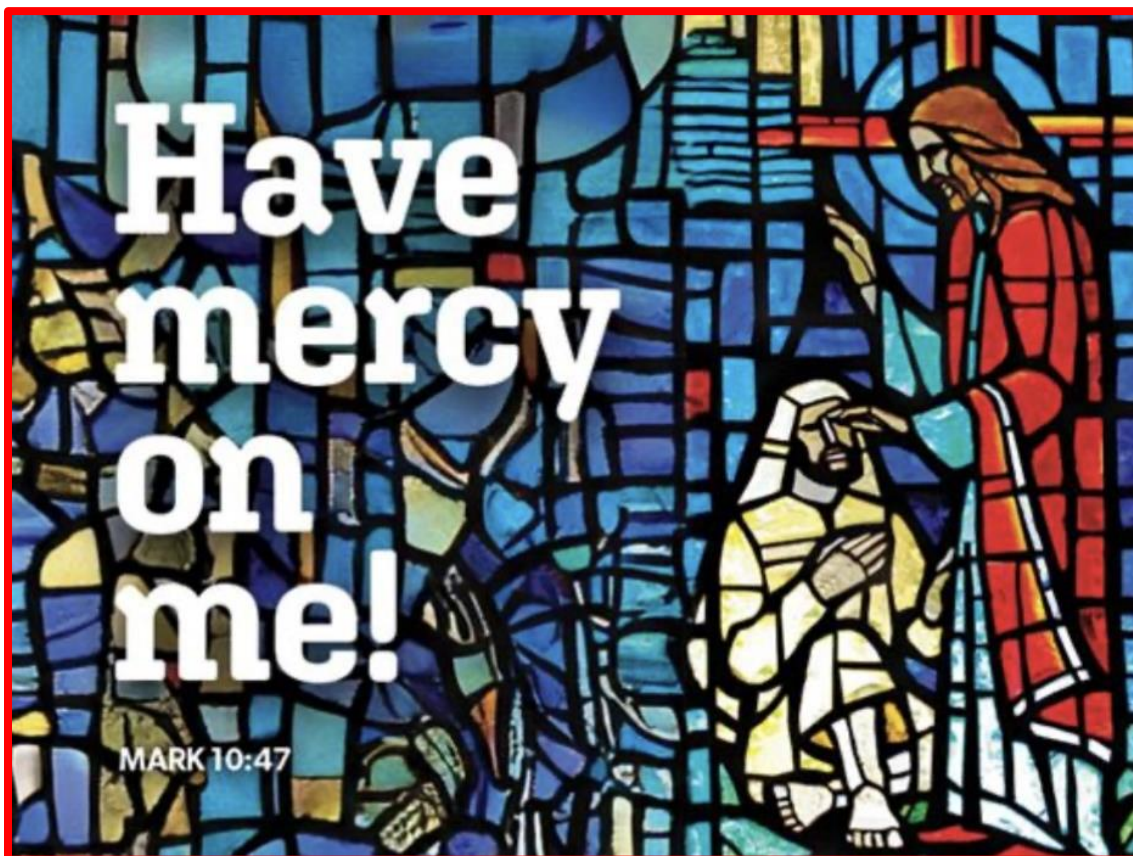

WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AT ZION

IN-PERSON: All are invited to join us for worship at 9:00 a.m. each Sunday morning.

ONLINE: Indoor worship services are live-streamed on the church YouTube channel: https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCIy_3AeK_pExuVhcUfI2cSw. If you are unable or prefer not to watch during the live-stream, the recording is available to view any time after the service concludes. When the service is held outdoors, there will be no live-stream.

SUNDAY MORNING INFORMATION

- ❖ Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.
- ❖ Children are welcome to be active participants in the worship service. Children are invited to come forward for the Children's Chat. The Puppet Theater will share a special message on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month. In addition, there are bags located at the back of the sanctuary with quiet worship activities and goodies to take home. Currently, nursery care is not available but you may use the parlor as a cry room while also still being able to listen to the service.

REFORMATION SUNDAY INTRODUCTION

Can we, like the Reformers and like Bartimaeus, pray with the boldness that comes from relying on God's mercy? In the time of the Reformation, voices cried out for justice and reform, challenging the corrupt powers of the day. Just as Bartimaeus called Jesus "Son of David," making a politically dangerous claim, the Reformers made bold claims about Christ's lordship, defying unjust structures. Could our prayers today be a challenge to the injustices of our time? Like Bartimaeus, the Reformers refused to be silenced. On this Reformation Sunday, do we ask boldly for God's mercy, and are we ready to answer Jesus when he asks us, "What do you want me to do for you?" This day reminds us that we, too, rely fully on God's grace, not on our own works, and through that grace, we can call out with confidence and boldness, trusting in the mercy of Christ to heal and transform.










NICENE CREED

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER FOR REFORMATION SUNDAY

(Based On Mark 10:46-52)

P: Holy God, you alone are holy, you alone are God. The heavens and earth declare your praise: in the cry of the blind, in the faith of the seeking, in the joy of the restored.

C: We praise you, O God.

P: From generation to generation, you lead your people: through the cries of Bartimaeus, in the hearts of reformers, and into the future through your saving grace.

C: We bless you, O God.

P: We give you thanks for your Son, Jesus Christ, who sought out the forgotten, lifted up the shamed, and opened the eyes of the blind. In his healing presence, you reformed our understanding of honor, calling us not to works or wealth but to faith and grace.

C: We thank you, O God.

P: On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: “This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

P: We pray for the gift of your Spirit, reforming and renewing your church. Through this meal, unite us in your grace, opening our eyes to the truth of the Gospel, that we may serve others with compassion, lift up the broken, and proclaim your love to all. Blessing, praise, and thanks to you, holy God, through Christ Jesus, by your Spirit, in your church, without end.

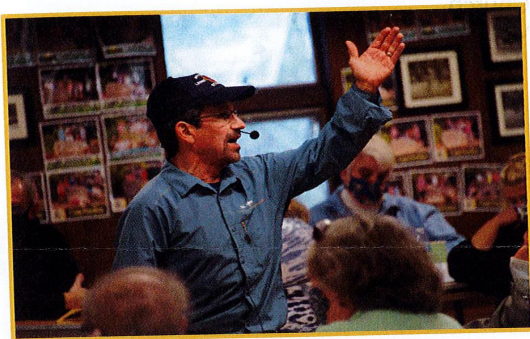

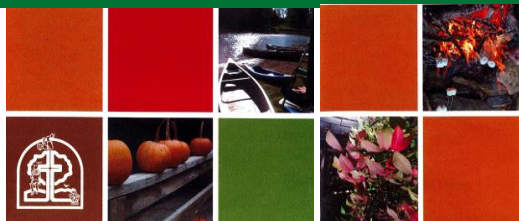
