FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

SECOND READING

Hebrews 1:1-4; 2:5-12

A: ¹Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, ²but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. ³He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, ⁴having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

^{2:5}Now God did not subject the coming world, about which we are speaking, to angels. ⁶But someone has testified somewhere, "What are human beings that you are mindful of them, or mortals, that you care for them? ⁷You have made them for a little while lower than the angels; you have crowned them with glory and honor, ⁸subjecting all things under their feet."

Now in subjecting all things to them, God left nothing outside their control. As it is, we do not yet see everything in subjection to them,⁹but we do see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

¹⁰It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings. ¹¹For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father. For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters, ¹²saying, "I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters, in the midst of the congregation I will praise you."







WHO WOULD JESUS BLESS TODAY?



Many Bibles include a heading before the latter part of today's gospel reading (Mark 10:13-16) that says something like "Blessing the Children" or "Jesus Welcomes the Children." In reading such a heading, we might begin to imagine a sentimental scene in which Jesus is surrounded by cute, adorable children. When we think about children being blessed in our churches today, we might imagine children gathering around the altar or at the front of the worship space for a children's time, in which the pastor or worship leader would say a prayer with them and give them a blessing. The parents and others may also be gathered just behind the children, smiling in adoration of these young ones.

However, we cannot view the scene from Mark's gospel with only our modern understanding of the role and place of children in society. The life of many children in North America is one of relative privilege, with carefree days in which they often experience the care and love of grown-ups. Jesus, by bringing the children to him, identifies himself with those who were among the most vulnerable and helpless in society. In ancient times, children often were treated like property. They had few protections from those who would treat them badly. But Jesus came into the world for ones such as these children. Who, in our communities, is in the place of the children of ancient times? As Christ's church, do we provide a place of welcome and care for the most vulnerable and weak in our society?

LET THE CHILDREN COME

Jesus takes children seriously, and as his followers we are called into the big work of clearing a path for their spiritual development. One of the most welcoming things we can do for children, indeed for all people, is to call them by name. This assures them that we see them, we remember them, and we connect them in the web of community. Knowing the importance of names makes it that much more important to try to learn the name of each child in your community and to encourage others to do the same.



IMAGES IN THE READINGS

One flesh is the biblical language for the effect and goal of sexual intercourse. Some philosophers in antiquity proposed that the first human was androgynous. After male and female sexes split, the two sexes sought each other out to regain a primal wholeness.

In the biblical world, a child was the least and had no independent status. Under Roman law, the father had the right to discard any infant born to him or to his household.

The Hebrew noun kenegdo, traditionally translated in English as "helpmeet," is now usually translated "helper." In Psalm 121:1-2, the same noun is used for God.

The author of Hebrews sees the universe as a hierarchy, with God on top and then angels, humans, animals, and on down the created order to inanimate things. Philosophically this has been referred to as the Great Chain of Being. The letter to the Hebrews understands that in the incarnation Jesus Christ moved from a higher to a lower place—thus the discussion about the placement of angels. Jews adopted pagan language about angels from neighbors.



and those who have lost everything. THANK YOU to everyone who helped make these outreach projects a success!


WANT TO HELP WITH LWR SHIPPING COSTS?


