



The widow begs for justice; God grants justice to those who cry to him.

A flat reading of Scripture treats the Bible as a weapon — a way to win arguments, prove correctness, or draw lines between insiders and outsiders.


It keeps us in the mindset of "for" and "against."



It draws us, like Jacob at Peniel, into a face-to-face encounter where truth is not something we control or possess, but something revealed to us through love.

PRAYER

A: Lord of the harvest, we return to you a portion of what you have given to us. Turn us to set our hope not on the uncertainty of riches, but on you, who richly provides for us. Multiply what we have gathered to bless all who are suffering and in need, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: Blessed are you, Holy God, whose love is higher and deeper, longer and wider than we can ask or imagine. You spoke creation into being—heaven and earth, sea and sky—and shaped us in your image to share your delight.

When Jacob wrestled through the night, you did not abandon him to his fear but blessed him with a new name and opened his eyes to see your face in Esau, his brother. When your people groaned in Egypt, you heard their cries and led them out—no longer slaves, but image-bearers of your freedom.

You watch over our going out and our coming in, from this time forth and forevermore. And through the prophets and the Scriptures, you breathed your Spirit to reveal the true character of your heart in Jesus Christ—the one who both shows us who you are and who we are called to be.

In his love we have life; in his cross we see your mercy without measure. On the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

And so we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your Spirit upon this bread and cup, that we may know your presence in our hunger and hope. Make this meal our strength, so that we never lose heart. Root us and ground us in your love, until all creation is gathered at your table, and every heart knows your peace.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor are yours, almighty God, now and forever.




