FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

This grace was given to us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, ¹⁰but it has now been revealed through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel. ¹¹For this gospel I was appointed a herald and an apostle and a teacher, ¹²and for this reason I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know the one in

whom I have put my trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard until that day what I have entrusted to him. ¹³Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴Guard the good treasure entrusted to you, with the help of the Holy Spirit living in us.


BLESSING OF BLANKETS & CARE KITS







PRESENTATION

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Sponsors: We present Gabrielle Marie Bailey for baptism.

P: Gabrielle Marie Bailey, called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized into Christ? Gabby: I do.

P: Millie and David, as sponsors, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

- to live with Gabby among God's faithful people,
- to remind her to come hear the word of God and receive the holy supper,
- to teach her the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments,
- to place in her hands the holy scriptures, and
- to nurture her in faith and prayer

so that Gabby may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help Gabby grow in faith and life? Sponsors: We do.

- P: People of God, do you promise to support Gabby and pray for her in her new life in Christ?
- C: We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

P: Gabby, I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

Gabby: I renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? Gabby: I renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? Gabby: I renounce them.

- P: (To all gathered) Do you believe in God the Father?
- C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell.
 On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THANKSGIVING

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.
- P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- **C:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- P: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death

and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you. Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

C: Amen.

BAPTISM

- P: Gabrielle Marie Bailey is baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen. You belong to Christ, in whom you have been baptized. Alleluia.
- P: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your daughters and sons new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering his love for us on the way, at the table, and to the end, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

- C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: We pray for the gift of your Spirit: in our gathering; within this meal; among your people; throughout the world. Blessing, praise, and thanks to you, holy God, through Christ Jesus, by your Spirit, in your church, without end.

Those who do not or choose not to partake of the sacrament may come forward and receive a blessing. If you are unable to come forward, please let one of the ushers know and the pastor will come to you.

FOR THOSE COMMUNING WITH THE KITS

Open the wafer packet.

- P: The body of Christ given for you.
- C: Amen.

Open the cup.

- P: The blood of Christ shed for you.
- C: Amen.

Please place communion cups & wrappers in the trash can as you exit the Sanctuary.

FOR THOSE COMMUNING BY COMING FORWARD

For those not able to have red wine, there is grape juice in the outer circle of every tray. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."

AFTER COMMUNING

Please use this time for quiet reflection until all worshippers have communed and have returned to their seat. Fill out the communion card to keep your record up to date.

Please stand if you are able.

POST-COMMUNION BLESSING

- P: The body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, strengthen you and keep you in his grace.
- C: Amen.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

- A: God of the abundant table, you have refreshed our hearts in this meal with bread for the journey. Give us your grace on the road that we might serve our neighbors with joy; for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Lord.

BRICK POINTING IN PROGRESS

Work has started on the Social Hall Walls! Brick pointing will be done on Zion's old bell tower and social hall walls through this month. Scaffolding has already been erected and work will begin shortly. The mortar joints on much of the outside walls are over 100 years old and have deteriorated. The loose mortar in the joints will be ground out and refilled with new. Once this is done the outside walls will be sprayed with a sealant



that will prevent water from penetrating. The work is being done by Krimmel Contracting. Krimmel is a multi-generational family-owned masonry contractor with excellent references from local churches.
