Probably not, but wrestling with the word and being persistent in our every encounter with the divine will be blessed! Thanks be to God.

THE RITE OF HOLY BAPTISM

God brings those who are baptized out of death and into life.

Keys: P = Pastor R = Response by parents G = Godparents C = Congregation

We welcome to the font this morning Tucker Jon Wright and his parents, Chris and Brittany Wright, Tucker's Godparents Ryan and Stephanie Stitzel, and his grandparents Karen and Jon Wright.

THE INTRODUCTION

P: God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of Baptism. By water and the Word, God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Baptismal candidate is presented by the candidate's Godparents.

P: Ryan and Stephanie, who do you present for Holy Baptism?

G: We present Tucker Jon Wright for Baptism.

The presiding minister addresses Chris and Brittany.

P: Chris and Brittany, called by the Holy Spirit and trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Tucker Jon baptized into Christ?

R: We do.

P: As you bring Tucker to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities:

to live with him among God's faithful people, bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, nurture him in faith and prayer so he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

Do you promise to help Tucker grow in the Christian faith and life?

R: We do.

The presiding minister addresses the parents.

P: Chris and Brittany, do you promise to nurture Tucker in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

R: We do.

The presiding minister addresses the congregation.

P: People of God, will you support Tucker and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

C: We will.

THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses Tucker's parents.

P: Chris and Brittany, I now ask you, on behalf of Tucker, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

R: We renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

R: We renounce them.

P: Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

R: We renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses Tucker's parents, and the congregation. Please stand if you are able.

P: Do you believe in God the Father?

R/C: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

R/C: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

R/C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

THE THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you,

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The presiding pastor says Luther's Flood Prayer.

P: We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

C: Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Water is gently poured on Tucker's head, as the following is said:

P: Tucker Jon, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

PRESENTATION OF THE BAPTISMAL GARMENT

The presiding minister places the baptismal garment on Tucker and then continues:

P: Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your sons and daughters new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

C: Amen.

PRAYERS FOR THE HOLY SPIRIT & THE LAYING ON OF HANDS

The presiding pastor places her hands on Tucker and says:

P: Sustain Tucker with the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

C: Amen.

SIGNING OF THE CROSS

As the sign of the cross is made on Tucker's forehead, the presiding pastor says:

P: Tucker Jon, child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

C: Amen.

WELCOME

Karen and Jon Wright, as representatives of the congregation and Tucker's grandparents, will present the newly baptized with a lighted candle and will say:

Rep: Tucker Jon, let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

The baptismal group faces the congregation and Karen and Jon Wright lead the congregation in the welcome.

Rep: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

C: Tucker Jon, we welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share. Join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

† THE WORD †

God speaks to us in Scriptures read, sung, and preached.

FIRST READING

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had.

Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip. [Note: "Peniel" and "Penuel" are the same place, spelled differently in varying manuscripts.]

2 Timothy 3:14-4:5

A: A reading from 2 Timothy.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.
