ABOUT TODAY: Today's readings from Luke and 2 Timothy definitely provide us with challenges. Luke reminds us to pray always and not to lose heart. Paul reminds us in 2 Timothy to be persistent and steadfast in our faith. Is this easy for us to do? Probably not, but wrestling with the word and being persistent in our every encounter with the divine we will be blessed! Thanks be to God.

RESTROOMS are located near each entrance to the worship area.

HEARING AID DEVICES are available on the table in the entrance hall.

CHILDREN are welcome as active participants in the worship service. There are activity bags and books available at the "Children's Corner" in the back of the worship area. There is childcare available in the pre-school Sunday School room for children ages 5 and under if you chose not to keep your child in the worship service. Alternatively, the Parlor may also be used as a "cry room" where the worship service can still be heard. Parents or two people certified by Zion's Safe Church Policy must always remain with a child. Any child (2-12 years old) who leaves the worship area during the service, must be accompanied by a parent.

For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

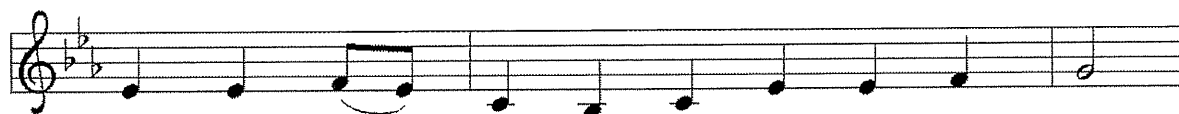

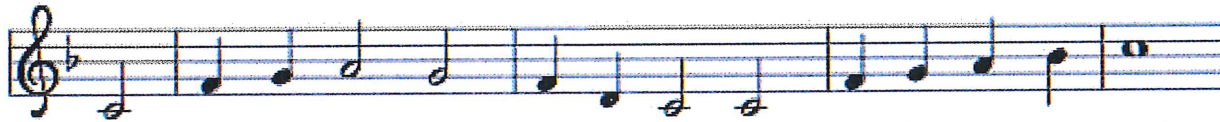

Upon returning to seat you are invited to meditate while quiet communion music is played.









