





How the city and the university survived and rebuilt its football program amid daunting odds is the basis of this month's Matinee Movie at the Zone. Starring Matthew McConaughy, Matthew Fox, David Strathairn, Ian McShane and Kate Mara, the plot builds on actual events and is an inspiration to the tenacity of faith, hope and love.

Released in 2006, the running time is 131 minutes and the rating is PG due to some graphic scenes of tragedy.

God bless you and prayer you stay with me longer and longer as my sponsor. All from your child, Brenda


ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES






