We celebrated the success of the ReVITALization initiative on Sunday, October 16! Introduced this past April, the celebration a week ago marked the culmination of over six months of sharing our time and talents. The video shown during worship highlighted the many ways members engaged in acts of love and service in the life of our congregation and community. Members of the congregation responded to the initiative -- whether by undertaking a property project, lending a hand in an outreach program, faithfully and regularly attending worship services, making financial contributions, or tackling some other behind-the-scenes work – they are all signs of God's love flowing through Zion. For all of the ways in which people stepped up, we express our thanks and gratitude!

Together, we have come a long way from the spiritually dreary and seemingly lifeless period during the COVID-19 pandemic when worship services and church activities were, for a time, curtailed altogether.
