FOR THOSE WORSHIPPING IN-PERSON

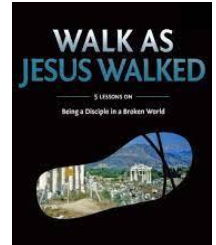


WIRED WORD SUNDAY SCHOOL IS BACK

WANT TO HELP WITH LWR SHIPPING COSTS?

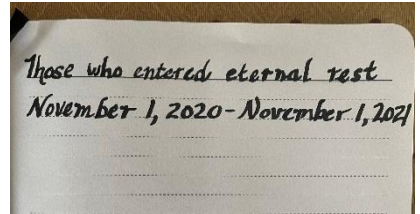
