- ❖ Restrooms are available by the front entrance of the church in the narthex and in the hallway off the back door. Infant changing tables can be found in the women's and men's bathrooms in the hallway off the back door.

Prediction of the passion.

MARK 9:37

In Mark 9:30-37, Jesus teaches the disciples who want to be "first" they should want to be "last" and focus on serving others instead of trying to be in charge.

Jesus puts a child in the middle of the group to show that being vulnerable and unimportant in society is beautifully valuable, and he challenges the disciples' ideas of what it means to be "great."

Jesus rebukes the disciples when they argue about who is the "greatest," telling them that their desire for status is wrong and that they should focus on serving others.

By welcoming the child, Jesus shows that true followers should include and care for people who are often left out or considered unimportant.

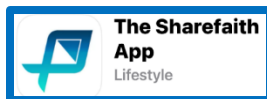
