

INTRODUCTION





Eager to be rich or eager to pursue richness of God's justice?.

A: ⁶ Of course, there is great gain in godliness combined with contentment; ⁷ for we brought nothing into the world, so that we can take nothing out of it; ⁸ but if we have food and clothing, we will be content with these. ⁹ But those who want to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many senseless and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction. ¹⁰ For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil, and in their eagerness to be rich some have wandered away from the faith and pierced themselves with many pains.

¹¹ But as for you, man of God, shun all this; pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, gentleness. ¹² Fight the good fight of the faith; take hold of the eternal life, to which you were called and for which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses. ¹³ In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you ¹⁴ to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁵ which he will bring about at the right time—he who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. ¹⁶ It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no one has ever seen or can see; to him be honor and eternal dominion. Amen.

¹⁷ As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. ¹⁸ They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, ¹⁹ thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

Story of poor Lazarus and the wealthy man.

- P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the 16th chapter.
- C: Glory to you, O Lord.
- P: [Jesus said:] ¹⁹ "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. ²⁰ And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, ²¹ who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. ²² The poor man died and was carried away by the angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. ²³ In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. ²⁴ He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' ²⁵ But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in agony. ²⁶ Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can

cross from there to us.' ²⁷ He said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send him to my father's house—²⁸ for I have five brothers—that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' ²⁹ Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets; they should listen to them.' ³⁰ He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' ³¹ He said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead.'"






This Kizhi icon of the prophet Amos,


from the Church of the Transfiguration on Kizhi Island in northern Russia,

We pray for all on Zion's prayer list—family, friends, and loved ones in every need. Give them courage when the way is unclear, freedom from all that binds, and strength when they are bowed down. Surround them with your steadfast love. God of grace,

receive our prayer.

We pray for this congregation, that we would not rest in comfort while others struggle, nor feast while neighbors hunger. Strengthen us to build a world where your manna is shared, and all have enough for the day. Stir our hearts to defend the oppressed, uphold the poor, and labor for justice. PRAYER

A: Lord of the harvest, we return to you a portion of what you have given to us. Turn us to set our hope not on the uncertainty of riches, but on you, who richly provides for us. Multiply what we have gathered to bless all who are suffering and in need, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen.

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P: Blessed are you, Holy God, who feeds the needy, lifts the lowly, and makes streams flow in the deserts of our lives. From the beginning you spread manna in the wilderness, teaching your people to trust in daily bread and not their own storehouses. When Elijah was faint with hunger, you sent messengers with bread, showing that your care does not fail.

You grieve when the powerful sprawl in ease, blind to the ruin of the poor, for the princes of this world cannot save. Yet you scatter the arrogant, lift up the humble, and fill the hungry with good things.

Your Anointed One proclaimed glad news to the poor. He told of great reversals, where Lazarus is lifted to Abraham's side and the mighty are cast down, that all might know your mercy. He ate with the outcast, welcomed the outsider, and made feasts for the lost and lonely.

In the fullness of time, you sent Jesus, born in lowliness, who shared our weakness and bore our hunger, that we might share his life.

On the night before he gave himself for us, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

And so we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

- C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P: Send your Spirit upon this bread and cup. Strengthen our hands to feed, our hearts to lift, our voices to proclaim your joy. Let us be joined with the poor, content with your daily bread. Fill the hungry. Raise the lowly. Make us bold to share your good news, until all creation feasts in your kingdom without end.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, now and forever.



When given the bread and cup, the communion ministers will say: "The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you," to which you may respond: "Amen."
















CLEANING HELP REQUESTED


