## God speaks to us in Scriptures read and preached.

### FIRST READING

Genesis 1:1-2:4a

A: A reading from Genesis.

In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters.

Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.

And God said, "Let there be a dome in the midst of the waters, and let it separate the waters from the waters." So God made the dome and separated the waters that were under the dome from the waters that were above the dome. And it was so. God called the dome Sky. And there was evening and there was morning, the second day.

And God said, "Let the waters under the sky be gathered together into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. God called the dry land Earth, and the waters that were gathered together he called Seas. And God saw that it was good. Then God said, "Let the earth put forth vegetation: plants yielding seed, and fruit trees of every kind on earth that bear fruit with the seed in it." And it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation: plants yielding seed of every kind, and trees of every kind bearing fruit with the seed in it. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the third day.

And God said, "Let there be lights in the dome of the sky to separate the day from the night; and let them be for signs and for seasons and for days and years, and let them be lights in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth." And it was so. God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night—and the stars. God set them in the dome of the sky to give light upon the earth, to rule over the day and over the night, and to separate the light from the darkness. And God saw that it was good. And there was evening and there was morning, the fourth day.

And God said, "Let the waters bring forth swarms of living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the dome of the sky." So God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, of every kind, with which the waters swarm, and every winged bird of every kind. And God saw that it was good. God blessed them, saying, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the waters in the seas, and let birds multiply on the earth." And there was evening and there was morning, the fifth day.

And God said, "Let the earth bring forth living creatures of every kind: cattle and creeping things and wild animals of the earth of every kind." And it was so. God made the wild animals of the earth of every kind, and the cattle of every kind, and everything that creeps upon the ground of every kind. And God saw that it was good.

Then God said, "Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the wild animals of the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." So God created humankind in his image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the air and over every living thing that moves upon the earth."

God said, "See, I have given you every plant yielding seed that is upon the face of all the earth, and every tree with seed in its fruit; you shall have them for food. And to every beast of the earth, and to every bird of the air, and to everything that creeps on the earth, everything that has the breath of life, I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. God saw everything that he had made, and indeed, it was very good. And there was evening and there was morning, the sixth day.

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all their multitude. And on the seventh day God finished the work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all the work that he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all the work that he had done in creation.

These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created.

## SERMON FOR HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY

## In the name of the Father, and of the † Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

P: Well, today is another festival of the church. This one is even more forgotten than last Sunday's festival, the Day of Pentecost.

Today is Holy Trinity Sunday, and you, like many others, might say, "So what? What is it?" and to that I would have to say Trinity Sunday is the day I'm expected to preach about the loving attributes and divine composition of the Holy Trinity. While that might sound easy, there's one huge problem ... no one really knows much about the Holy Trinity.

Matthew 28:16-20

But what I can say about the Holy Trinity is that it's not an historical event like Christmas or Easter. In fact, there's no mention of the Trinity, as such, in the Bible.

Now, just because it doesn't appear in the Bible, don't think this omission means the Trinity doesn't exist. Just perish that thought. When it comes to the Trinity, God has elected to keep some things to himself. After all, God doesn't have to share everything with us.

What I can also say is that the Trinity is a doctrine of the church, an article of faith, that we believe in whole heartedly, and that's evidenced by our constant use of the words, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," Amen.

Maybe the following conversation between a father and his son will shed some light on the topic of the Trinity ... maybe it won't. But, let's give it a try. This conversation begins with the child asking a question and the father responding. That pattern is used throughout the conversation. So here goes:

- C: Dad, I've got a question.
- P: What is it, Son?
- C: Well, today in Sunday School, we talked about God.
- P: God, huh. Maybe you should talk to your mother.
- C: Come on, Dad.
- P: Okay, Son, what's your question?
- C: Well, our teacher was trying to explain the Trinity ...you know, God in three persons?
- P: Son, I REALLY think this is a Mom question, don't you?
- C: Dad ...
- P: All right, what's your question?
- C: Well, I guess it's just confusing. I mean, I've never met a Trinity before. Have you?
- P: What do you mean, Son.
- C: Everyone I know is just one person, not three.
- P: I see. And this worries you?

- C: Well, it's just confusing, Dad. I mean, who is this Trinity God supposed to be?
- P: That's a good question, Son.
- C: (PAUSE) Well ...
- P: Well, what?
- C: Don't you have some wonderful parental insight to help me out, here?
- P: Ah, right. Well, let me think. God is like H<sup>2</sup>O, you know -- ice, liquid, and steam all H<sup>2</sup>O, but different forms.
- C: So ... God is like water?
- P: Well, not exactly. Oh, okay. Let's try this: Take you our Mother, for instance. She's one person, but she's also a mother, a wife and a daughter.
- C: So, you're saying Mom is God?
- P: Let's not go there, Son. Let me think some more.
- C: What about the beauty of a flower, or the smile or a baby?
- P: What? How is that like the Trinity?
- C: I don't know, but when I see something like that, I know that God must have had a hand in it.
- P: I would agree with you there, Son.
- C: But, which one?
- P: Which one what?
- C: Which God is involved in something like that?
- P: I am not following you here, Son.
- C: Well, if God is three persons, which person makes the flowers bloom? Which person breathes new life into a baby?
- P: Now wait, remember we have a rule in this house. Mom answers all questions about babies, okay?
- C: Not just babies, Dad, everything. Which person paints the colors of the sunset? Which person listens to me when no one else will? Which one?
- P: Wow. These are good questions, Son.

- C: Which one is it? And how do we know? And who decides? And do they ever argue with each other? Do they live in the same place? Can you see them all, or just some of them? How can you tell them apart? Are they identical? Is it just three, or could it be four, or five, or more?
- P: (LONG PAUSE staring at Child) Son, the Trinity is like an apple, it has a core, the meat of the apple, and the skin ...

C: Dad?

- P: Or maybe, like a three-leafed clover?
- C: You don't know do you, Dad?

P: Or a triangle?

- C: I'll go ask Mom, or whoever she is!
- P: Or three interlocking circles ...?



There's no doubt about it. The concept of the Trinity can be confusing ... it's tough to wrap our heads around it. And the truth of the matter is, no matter how much we think about it, no matter how much we talk or argue about it, we will never really comprehend its depth and complexity.

But what we do know and what we can comprehend is that we have a God in Jesus who came to earth and taught us to love our neighbor as our selves. He taught us not to judge others but to treat them with kindness and humility.

When we pray to God through the Spirit, we are the living experience of the Holy Trinity. The Spirit's breathing, the Son's intercession, and the Father's will ... these three become one in us.

As the child in the opening conversation says:

C: Which one is it? And how do we know? And who decides? And do they ever argue with each other? Which one is it? Is it one and three at the same time?

Keep in mind, the Trinity isn't a vague doctrinal experience, it's personal. The Trinity is God relating to each of us on a personal level. The Trinity isn't some puzzle to be solved, but a relationship of love to be lived. And how do we know? Because we each have a relationship with the God who loves us unconditionally,

the son who intercedes on our behalf, and the guiding breath of the Holy Spirit within us.

And while we might not know just what the triune relationship means to God, we do know what it means to us: Our God loves us, liberates us, and continues to bless us.

I might not know exactly how God does it, but let me tell you, I'm very thankful he does.

And so, "In the name of the Father, and of the † Son, and of the Holy Spirit", I say, "Thanks be to God!" Amen.

## NICENE CREED

While Augustine, a great theologian, philosopher, and Bishop, was working on his book entitled *On the Trinity*, he was walking by the seaside one day, meditating on the difficult problem of how God could be three persons at once. He came upon a little child. The child had dug a little hole in the sand, and with a seashell was scooping water from the sea into the small hole. Augustine watched him for a while and finally asked the child what he was doing. The child answered that he would scoop all the water from the sea and pour it into the little hole in the sand. "What?" Augustine said. "That is impossible. Obviously,

the sea is too large and the hole too small." "Indeed,' said the child. But it is not more impossible than what you are trying to do – comprehend the immensity of the mystery of the Holy Trinity with your small mind!" Augustine stopped at his words and glanced away from the boy, surprised by the boy's response. When he turned back to the boy, he discovered he had vanished!



So, who was the child at the seaside who seemed to understand Augustine's limited understanding of the Holy Trinity and seemed to baffle Augustine? Augustine turned away from the child in amazement. Why was Augustine amazed ... by the disappearance of the child or what the child may have represented? What do you think?
