"Two roads diverged in a yellow wood and sorry I could not travel both"

Those words by Robert Frost have traveled with me since I first heard them at a lecture by Frost in the early 1960s. He sat on the stage, a small man nestled in a large chair. He read poems and answered questions for an audience of town's people and students from the local prep school. Here was a frail older man (he died in 1963 at the age of almost 90) speaking the truth of life to mostly very young people. **The Road Less Traveled** eloquently outlined a meaningful outline for life.

"I shall be telling this with a sigh Somewhere ages and ages hence: Two roads diverged in a wood, and I— I took the one less traveled by, And that has made all the difference."

These last lines of the poem are words for the Christian to make part of their lives. Christians make a daily decision to select the less traveled road. It is a conscious decision to fellow Jesus, reach out to others; to have a positive attitude; and to work to make the world a better place.
